Hungarian Red Boss Relieved Of Position

VIENNA (AP) — Ernoe Geroy, Hungary's No. 2 Communist, has been relieved of his job as first deputy prime minister and minister of the interior, Radio Budapest announced last night.

Appointed as new minister for interior was Laszlo Piro, who reportedly succeeded Gabor Peter as head of the ill-famed Hungarian state secret police, after the latter's purge last year.

Geroy, Radio Budapest said, will be appointed to another important position.

Japanese Blame U. S. For Red Move In Nation

TOKYO (AP) — The English language Japan News said Tuesday the occupation policies of a U.S. government group dedicated to purging the royal family and abolishing big business got communism off to a flying start in post-war Japan.

The newspaper said the group was "protected" by former Secretary of State Dean Acheson. (In Washington, State Department officials denied there was ever any occupation group set up to purge the royal family. A spokesman said U.S. policy was just the opposite.)

(As to abolishing big business, the spokesman said it was routine after World War II for the Allies to dissolve heavy industry and cartels to make it difficult for Japan and Germany to make war again.)

Japan News carried long excerpts of what the newspaper said was an official State Department secret report written in Tokyo in 1948 and sent to the department in Washington. It was prepared by a responsible official, the News said, and was obtained from an American connected with the U. S. occupation here. It did not identify the report or the writer.

Thorne's Death Probe Continues; Mother Quizzed

CHICAGO (AP) — The wealthy mother of Montgomery Ward Thorne pointed to the heavens Tuesday and declared she knows her son is "up there" and that "I thank God for now I will always know where he is."

Mrs. Marion Thorne, clad in a black dress with white collar and cuffs, made the remark during testimony into the sudden death of her son June 29. He died 10 days after he revised his will sharply slashing his mother's share.

Mrs. Thorne was flanked on both sides by her attorneys who objected repeatedly to questions that were put to her by Coroner Walter McCarron.

McCarron asked her why 20-year-old Monty moved out of her 13-room Gold Coast district apartment to take a \$75-a-month room nearby.

She said he left because she refused to allow some of his companions into her home.

"They were not the kind of boys I wanted him to be with," she said.

Her attorneys maintained that many of McCarron's questions went into the question of Monty's will, while the coroner shot back that he was merely trying to learn the cause of the youth's sudden death.

In his second will, Thorne left one half his nearly two million dollar estate to his sweetheart, Miss Maureen Ragen, 18, and one fourth to her mother, Aleen. He gave his mother a one-eighth share. His mother was the principal beneficiary in the first will he made two years ago.

The cause of young Thorne's death will not be determined until perhaps the end of this week. The coroner's office expects to complete its chemical analysis of the vital organs by then.

Mrs. Thorne did not appear at three previous sessions of the inquest, contending she was too ill.

Social Security Plan Attacked By Physician

WASHINGTON (AP) — The president-elect of the Assn. of American Physicians and Surgeons attacked social security Tuesday as an "un-American and part of a 'socialistic scheme' to destroy liberty."

Members of the Senate Finance Committee listened in silence as Dr. James L. Doenges of Anderson, Ind., declared:

"Contrary to some thinking, social security is not a permanent part of the American way of life. It is foreign spawned and nurtured, the parent of socialism, and one of the most important parts of every socialist scheme for obtaining and keeping control of the citizenry by destroying individual liberty."

Doenges described the association as an organization of some 13,000 medical doctors dealing only with "socio-economic and legislative problems." He also is president of the Madison County (Ind.) Medical Society.

An Eisenhower administration request to bring doctors into the social security system, Doenges said, is in effect a "calculated fraud upon the physicians." Doctors who failed to retire, he said, would not receive benefits and thus would be "forced to pay additional discriminatory and unfair tax."

He continued: "I do not believe that members of Congress feel it is fair or by any stretch of the imagination right to force any group into this type of situation. It would leave only two alternatives: Retire and reduce needed medical care for the sick or be forced to pay an additional tax into a fraudulent system."
