New Rural Route Serving Glendale

Some 60 families living on Reuben Road near Glendale who have not previously received rural mail delivery service from the Glendale postoffice on July 1. At the same time, Jack Dillon of Glendale, successful winner in government bidding, took over operation of the route, formerly contracted by Ralph Place and operated by Mrs. Laska Miller. The route served, in addition to the new area, Windy Creek road and the entire loop between Glendale and Azalea, both old and new highways. Mail is also delivered to the Azalea Postoffice.

According to Howard Edson, Glendale postmaster, only about 15 of the patrons on Reuben Road have put up mailboxes at present, so that they may begin to receive their mail on the route. No delivery may be made until standard rural boxes are in place. The new section of the delivery route, which starts at the old Cow Creek bridge at the edge of Glendale, passes the Robert Dollar Mill and extends up the canyon as far as Pete Pegg's place. Families living beyond the Pegg place may place boxes at that point and receive service.

Dickinson, poultry veterinarian, will give a demonstration on how to autopsy a chicken, then give a short talk on respiratory diseases. Both field days are open to the public, Mosher said.

Holiday Causes Pile-Up Of Mail

Howard Edson, Glendale postmaster, says the Fourth of July holiday, further complicated by the recent curtailment of postoffice hours and mail train service, caused a serious pile-up of mail in the local post office. Not only was incoming mail a more than ordinary problem, but the "in-the-door" mail box at the postoffice had filled and run over with mail which could not legally be processed until after the holiday.

Edson further stated that under the new regulations, for normal weekends, mail goes out of Glendale by locked pouch on Saturday nights, and no letters may be mailed at the train. On Sunday night, however, letters can be put on the train by patrons who wait and hand them to the attendant personally. However, mail placed in the slot at the postoffice will not go out until Monday evening since there is no postoffice attendant to sort and process it on Sundays.
