

Security Risk Cleared At Army's Ft. Monmouth

FT. MONMOUTH, N.J. — Bernard Martin, a technical writer suspended a year ago from Ft. Monmouth as a purported security risk, has been cleared and reinstated.

In an announcement Monday, Army authorities said Martin had been notified July 9 he could return to work at the electronic center Tuesday. But the Army did not disclose whether Martin would be put back on his old job.

Reportedly, Martin was one of 21 Ft. Monmouth employees suspended from their jobs as alleged security risks and given hearings by the first Army review board. Martin thus would be the first of the group cleared publicly.

Columbia River Fisheries Inspection Gets Underway

SEATTLE — A four-day inspection of power installations, dams, hatcheries and fishways in the Columbia River watershed will be started Wednesday by Oregon and Washington fish department officials and legislators.

The Washington group will take a look at fishways and power sites on the Yakima, Wenatchee and Columbia Rivers in Washington to start the inspection trip.

On Thursday, Washington officials will join with Oregon representatives to inspect McNary and The Dalles dams.

Friday, the combined group will inspect the new 460-foot long fishway being constructed on the Wind River near Carson in Skamania County, Wash. The fishway, second longest of four being constructed in this state, will open up additional stretches of upstream areas for natural spawning and rearing of salmon.

The group will journey to Portland later Friday for a joint meeting with the Oregon Fish Commission to discuss financing of installations now being constructed in Oregon and Washington with federal funds under the Lower Columbia fisheries development program.

On Saturday the Washington group will inspect the new Toutle River hatchery and Deschutes River fishways.

Heading the group of Washington legislators will be Sen. Corwin P. Shank of Kirkland, chairman of the interim committee. Rep. Dwight S. Hawley of Seattle is secretary. Sen. Paul N. Luverson of Anacortes and Francis Pearson of Port Angeles; Rep. Hal G. Arnason, Jr., Bellingham; Chet King, Raymond, and Morris S. Swan, Vancouver, make up the committee.

The Washington Department of Fisheries will be represented by Robert J. Schoeller, director. Donald P. Gooding, Milo P. Bell and Donald R. Jackson.

Eisenhower And Wife Present At Funeral

STATE COLLEGE, Pa. — President and Mrs. Eisenhower came to this university town Tuesday for the funeral of the President's sister-in-law, Mrs. Milton S. Eisenhower.

The president and the first lady arrived by car from Altoona's Blair County airport 36 miles away after a flight from Washington in the presidential plane, the Columbine.

Accompanying them from Washington were Secretary of Agriculture Benson and his son, Mark; Sen. Frank Carlson (R-Kan.) and Mrs. Carlson; Sen. James H. Duff (R-Pa.) and Arthur S. Flemming, defense mobilization director.

Mrs. Eisenhower, 49, wife of Dr. Milton S. Eisenhower, president of the Pennsylvania State University, died on Saturday. Her husband is the President's youngest brother.

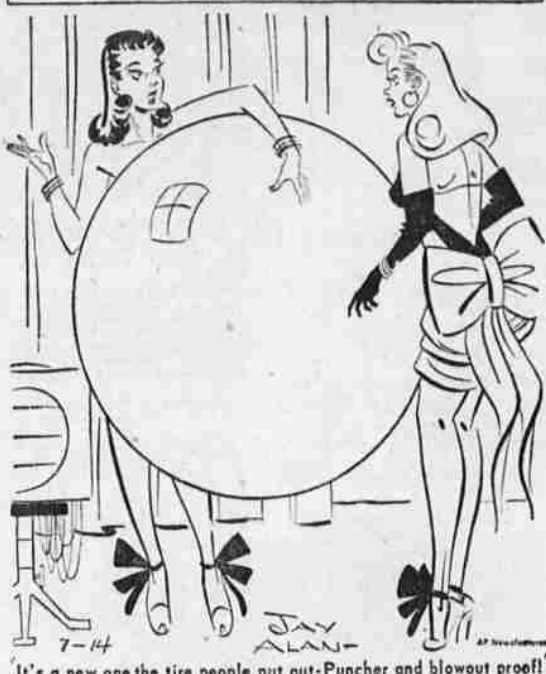

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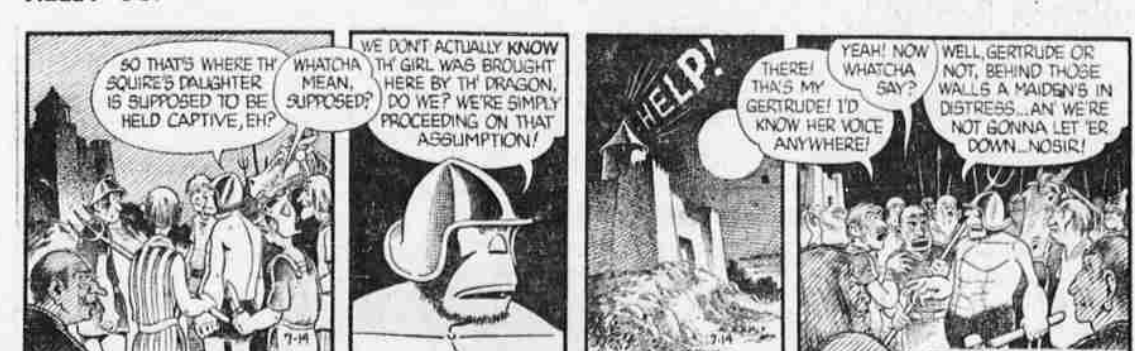

Governor Langlie Presented Oscar

BOLTON LANDING, N.Y. — Gov. Arthur B. Langlie of Washington Tuesday was awarded a gold traffic safety "Oscar" for his campaign against highway accidents.

J. W. Bethea, staff director of the President's Action Committee for Traffic Safety, presented the award of the National Committee for Traffic Safety to Langlie at the national governors conference.

Langlie said his program had had "a wonderful effect" in saving lives and reducing the number of law enforcement officers.

"We believe that within a matter of months he will start reducing automobile insurance by 10 to 15 million dollars a year" as a result of the state's safety program, Langlie added.

In a citation, the National Committee for Traffic Safety lauded Langlie "for executive leadership in state traffic safety." It said he had taken the lead "with dramatic constructive action" in cutting the traffic death toll by 54 in November and December 1953.

Ideas Of Senator Taft Are To Be Perpetuated

WASHINGTON — A non-profit organization to "perpetuate the ideals" of the late Sen. Taft (R-Ohio) was founded Tuesday, with former President Herbert Hoover as chairman.

The organization, described as non-political, will use its funds for religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes. It is called the Robert A. Taft Memorial Foundation, Inc.

A statement announcing that articles of incorporation were filed in Baltimore, said President Eisenhower has agreed to serve as honorary chairman for the first term.



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
