TOKYO (AP)—Red China's Peiping radio said today a "stone wall" in the way of an agreement has arisen at the Geneva conference on an Indochina cease-fire—and blamed it on the United States.

"It is clear... that the marking of time in the present decisive stage of the conference is due to American pressure for delaying an agreement," the Communist propaganda radio said.
