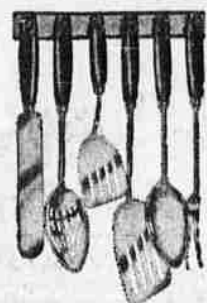

Woman's Body Found On Railroad Tracks

ALBANY, Ore. (U) — The body of Mrs. Albert Cross, 48, Albany, was found Friday on the Southern Pacific Railway's tracks here. A brakeman, William Banta, Portland, told Deputy Coroner John Summers he made the discovery after his freight train had entered a siding to let the SP Shasta daylight train pass. Summers said the woman, who had been in ill health, apparently had wandered from her home about a half block away. The body had been dragged about 80 yards. The woman wore only a dressing gown and slippers. She was the wife of a Halsey, Ore., seed and grain dealer.

Parrot Fever Outbreak Puts Ban On Bird Sales

PHILADELPHIA (U) — The bird departments in six city stores have been closed in an effort to combat the virus disease psittacosis, or parrot fever, the Philadelphia Health Department has disclosed. The department said 30 cases of the disease had been reported in the city. Acting Health Commissioner Dr. Norman I. Ingraham said this was "near epidemic proportions."

Communists Help U. N. Troops Get Dope, Says Chief

NEW YORK — The nation's chief narcotics fighter said Saturday that Communists are deliberately exposing U.N. troops to dope in South Korea and Japan. As a result, U.S. Narcotics Commissioner Harry J. Anslinger said, a "substantial" number of American troops in those areas have become dope addicts. Anslinger called the Reds' activity "a deliberate attempt to neutralize" U.N. forces. He testified before a Senate foreign relations subcommittee considering ratification of a protocol signed by 36 nations to curb world opium production and distribution. Anslinger also made these other points:

The Italian government is conducting "a very serious investigation" of reports that Charles (Lucky) Luciano, vice king who was deported from the United States is playing a major role in the illicit drug traffic. Most of the heroin reaching this country originates in Red China. He testified that American soldiers have risen sharply to more than 60,000 persons. The most effective way to fight addiction is for states to increase penalties for peddling. Anslinger told newsmen after testifying that American soldiers who turned to dope in the Far East have been returned home and discharged. He said the situation "is still current but the armed forces are doing their best."

Huge Ice Pellets Fall In Spokane Hail Storm

SPOKANE (U) — A sudden summer hailstorm that sent pellets as

large as eggs hurtling to the ground left a trail of damaged crops and buildings across Half Moon Prairie, 14 miles north of here, Friday.

Forming quickly out of a clear sky that had sent temperatures soaring to 91 degrees, the hailstorm was accompanied by heavy rain, which caused several small creeks to overflow and flood a number of roads. Electrical service between Spokane and Deer Park was knocked out for an hour and one-half when several Washington Water Power Co. poles were broken at the base.

Baby Sitter Accused Of Inflicting Burns

PROVIDENCE, R. I. (U) — Police today accused a 20-year-old baby sitter of inflicting cigarette burns on a 2-year-old girl — and then attempting to pass the burns off as a possible case of measles. Police Sgt. Edward J. Lovett identified the girl as Gertrude M. Polseno. She was booked on a charge of assault on Francine Coates, 2, daughter of Mrs. Darlene Coates, last July 8. Lovett said two witnesses told police Miss Polseno burned the child on the arms, legs and body, allegedly because she did not like the child's looks. Miss Polseno denied the accusation.
