EUGENE — The attitude of individuals toward the world's problems is the foundation on which solutions will be found, Dr. Ralph Bunche told an audience which overflowed the Erb Memorial Union ballroom on the University of Oregon campus here Tuesday night.

Dr. Bunche, director of the United Nations trusteeship division, was critical of what he called the popular American attitude that all the individual can do in times of crisis is to wait.

# Lavenia Admits Ex-Membership In Red Affiliate

WASHINGTON — Thomas W. Lavenia, office manager of McCarthy subcommittee, from whom the Defense Department has withheld security clearance, said Wednesday he once was a vice president of an organization Sen. McCarthy, (R-Wis.) has termed an "affiliate" of Communist fronts.

But Lavenia said he attended only one meeting of the organization, the American Law Students Assn., on the night of Dec. 26, 1939 when it elected him vice president.

McCarthy, who criticized the Defense Department for withholding clearance from Lavenia, told his Senate investigations subcommittee Tuesday he knows of no other reason on which the department may have based its decision.

McCarthy himself, in Senate speeches in 1950, had denounced Philip C. Jessup, then U. S. ambassador-at-large as a man with an "unusual affinity for Communist 'mist causes'" and pointed to Jessup's relationship with the American Law Students Assn. as one reason for the accusation.
