

Mantle Proves Worth In Chicago Game

One of the prime reasons for the recent rise of the New York Yankees is the blossoming of Mickey Charles Mantle into a big time big leaguer.

he 22-year-old switch hitting center fielder apparently has arrived, although some fans who regard Yankee miracles as common-

place feel he took a long time coming. Amid reams of ballyhoo the Yankees tried to jump Mantle from the Class C Western Association into Joe DiMaggio's job in 1951.

It didn't quite come off. Mantle had to go down to Kansas City for seasoning. He came back in 1952 for what would have been a sensational season for any normal rookie. He hit 23 home runs and finished with a .311 average.

But it wasn't enough for the fans who were still dreaming of DiMaggio. Mickey fell off to .295 last season and when he came up with an old knee injury during the winter the Yankees were really worried.

An operation put him out of com-

mission through much of spring training and he wasn't ready when the season started. But he's really rolling now.

His average of .323 is second high on the club. He leads the league in home runs with 20 and tops the Yankees in runs scored, triples, hits, runs batted in, total bases and bases on balls. He also has struck out the most, not too unusual for a distance hitter. In the first game of yesterday's double triumph by the Yankees over the Chicago White Sox, he drove in the tying run with a right-handed single in the eighth inning and the winning run with a left-handed home run into left field in the 10th. The score was 4-3. The Yankees coasted home in the second 11-1.

Cleveland Wins Couple Cleveland also won twice, 6-3 and 5-2 over Boston, and kept its half game first place lead.

Brooklyn climbed a game closer to the New York Giants with an 8-5 victory over Cincinnati while the Giants bowed to Chicago 13-5. New York still holds a six game edge.

In other action Milwaukee edged Philadelphia 3-2 and St. Louis shaded Pittsburgh by the same score in 14 innings in the National League.

Detroit defeated Philadelphia 9-4 and Washington beat Baltimore 3-2 in the American League.

Two home runs by Vic Wertz helped Bobby Peller post his seventh straight triumph in the first game at Boston. Bob Lemon tamed the Red Sox in the second game.

Oregon Golfers Win, Lose In Western Amateur Meet

SEATTLE (AP) — Eight golfers took the long road through the rough and rumpled Broadmoor layout Friday, knowing that one of them would wind up Sunday as the new Western Amateur champion.

The 1953 champion, Dale Morry of Indianapolis, was only a bystander as the quarter-final 18-hole round began, bumped out by a young upstart not yet out of college. But Ernie Tullis, a University of Washington Junior, was swinging a set of educated sticks when he took the measure of both Morry and par Thursday.

He beat the champion 2 and 1, opening their match with an eagle and standing two under par when they finished. Tullis lost his touch in the afternoon, scrambling around with a six over par total but holding on doggedly to beat George Beecher of Ontario, Ore., 1 up in 19 holes.

There's a very good chance the new champ will be a collegian. Moving into the role of favorite now is Bruce Cudd of Portland University, the 20-year-old Oregon Open titlist who went to the National Amateur semi-finals last year. He knocked out the tourney medalist, Maj. Harley Williams, 2 and 1, Thursday and then brushed aside Dave Barclay of Seattle, 3 and 1.

Phil Getchell of Medford, Ore., a junior at Stanford, trounced a favored Texan, Howard Johnson of Houston, 1-up. Eddie Meyerson of Los Angeles, a small, shy youngster who hits big and once won a National Junior crown, whipped George Harrington of Medford, Ore., 3 and 2. He was matched with Cudd Friday.

Not subscribing to the youth-must-be-served credo, Lt. Joseph Conrad of San Antonio rallied to whip 18-year-old Kevin Riley of Vancouver, B.C., 3 and 2. He drew

another youth Friday, meeting Getchell in the quarter-finals. Tullis took on Jim Shriver of Seattle, who bested Walter Conroy of Seattle, 2 up.

Nobody was hotter Thursday than Eddie Draper of Seattle, who was seven under par for the 15 holes it took him to wallop Harold Jacobson of Longview, Wash., 5 and 3. Friday he met Clarence Smith of Seattle, who bowled over Jim Mallory of the host city, 5 and 4.

Numbered among the Thursday casualties were Harry Givan of Seattle, former Walker Cupper,

and Walt McElroy of Vancouver, B.C. One of Canada's outstanding amateurs, McElroy played steady par golf but was ousted by Conroy's three-under-par effort, 4 and 2. Givan bowed to Mallory, 5 and 3.
