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Pentagon Frowns Upon Articles By 'Big Team'
WASHINGTON (AP) — The Pentagon has served notice on members of its "big team" that they would be "ill-advised" to write signed articles for publication.
A memorandum dated May 15 stated the Defense Department's "informal position" that "members of the big team are so busy and so occupied with their heavy responsibilities" that it would be "inappropriate" for them to devote time to writing for general publication.
Members of the "big team" are Secretary of Defense Wilson, his deputy and assistant secretaries, the civilian heads of the three armed services and their assistants, the chairman of the joint chiefs of staff and top echelon military commanders.
