The Southern Oregon Baseball League and the Drain Black Sox, southern Oregon baseball leaders for years, are eligible for the first time in nine years for the American Baseball Congress' state semi-pro tournament.

Any team which abides by the ABC baseball formula and belongs to an accredited league in the state is eligible to apply for entry into the tournament, but only 16 teams will be accorded seeding. Depending upon the number of applications, the Black Sox of Manager Roy Helser may or may not be one of the seeded tournament teams, although one of the Congress' stipulations is that a seeded team must be a league leader.

TEAM ENTRY deadline is Aug. 1; play runs from Aug. 9 to Sept. 1; Drain has clinched the SOL first place, so Helser naturally observes the Black Sox deserve one of the 16 team seedings in the state.

Behind Drain's eligibility this year and that of possibly other teams is the ruling regarding the number of ex-pros with a semi-pro team and the status of these ex-pros with their former professional owners. This year, Helser, Glenn (Jeep) Stetler and Bill Beard, the only ex-pros with the club, have all obtained releases from former owners, which include the Portland Beavers and Salem Senators. They have all sacrificed their waivers in the Coast League, and hence have given the Black Sox full ABC recognition.

WHETHER DRAIN goes into the tournament via a direct seed or a playoff game to gain a seeding, Manager Helser hopes to be able to enter with a 15-player squad. He is presently seeking another capable right-hand pitcher. The team presently equally divided among left and right handers from the batter's box.

While the ABC, Helser observes, is getting bigger all the time, it is slowly replacing the once more renowned National Baseball Congress semi-pro organization in the state. Although nothing official has been offered, Helser believes that for the second straight year the NBC will not be able to foot a tournament in Oregon, at Albany as planned.

Marciano Praises Charles' Ability

NEW YORK (AP) — Rocky Marciano thinks there is no danger of Ezzard Charles "doing a Walcott" in their September rematch.

In case it may have slipped your memory, "doing a Walcott" refers to the Rip Van Winkle bit that old Jersey Joe did in the first round of his ballyhooed rematch with the Rock at Chicago.

"I think the guy's got guts," he said. "I kept pressing him all the time from the sixth round on. A lot of other guys fell apart. Some took 11 rounds, some 12 or 13 but most of them fell apart sooner or later."

"Only twice did I think I had him ready to go—the 10th round and the 15th."

whether he thought he might have softened up Charles for a second fight. He wouldn't try to answer. "It was tough on both of us," he said. "He hurt me a few times and I hurt him."

In the six weeks since the first fight, Rocky has been "lazing around" first at Cape Cod and later at Grossinger, N.Y., where he does his training. For the first time in a long time he was able to go back home to Brockton, Mass., long enough to hear what the neighbors had to say about his fight.

"A lot of people said they were glad it went the way it did," he said. "They told me they were happy to see me prove I could go 15 rounds and still win. They mentioned how a lot of you fellows said I couldn't win if it went to a decision."

"I've been doing some thinking about the first fight, too. I wasn't exactly satisfied. This time I hope to do a little better."
