Public Enemy Meets Death In Blazing Spokane Battle

SPOKANE — A masked suspected robber who was shot and killed in a gun battle Tuesday night was identified by the sheriff's office Wednesday as one of the nation's "10 most wanted men."

Carl Zibulka, the sheriff's fingerprint expert, said an examination of the man's prints checked on 28 points with those of Lloyd Reed Russell, 33, wanted in Michigan for robbery, burglary, assault and unlawful flight to avoid confinement.

The man was first identified as Raymond M. Kidd, 35, but officers said Wednesday there was no said it had no fingerprint expert here and couldn't confirm the identification.

Cabinet Assistants To Talk In Portland

PORTLAND — Walter Bedell Smith, undersecretary of state, and Thomas Pike, assistant secretary of defense, are scheduled to speak at a conference on American foreign policy here Oct. 5-6.

Other speakers, including at least one Democratic and one Republican U. S. senator, are to attend also.

The conference is being sponsored jointly by the Portland and U. S. Chambers of Commerce.

Dairy Sanitary Rules Now Under One Code

SALEM — Revised regulations governing sanitary operations of dairy product plants became effective Aug. 1, the State Department of Agriculture announced.

They bring all matters relating to manufacture of dairy products into a single code, replacing five previous orders.

The principal change is adding an optional method of pasteurizing milk and cream.

Measure OKs Building Of Deschutes Reservoir

WASHINGTON — A bill authorizing construction of Haystack Reservoir on the Deschutes Irrigation project in Central Oregon was passed by the House and sent to the White House.

The reservoir is expected to cost \$1,600,000. The bill also has an extension of time for repayment on the North Unit of the project.

LICENSE SUSPENDED

PORTLAND — The license of Higashi and Stevenson grocery at Salem has been suspended for 30 days by the Oregon Liquor Control Commission.

The action was taken after the firm was charged with selling alcoholic beverages to a minor and with failure to demand a statement of age certificate from a minor.

County Blood Chairman To Aid Donor Program

Mrs. Walter Britnell, county blood recruitment chairman for the American Red Cross, has been selected to take part in a meeting at Portland Friday to launch a new phase of the donor recruitment program.

Mrs. R. E. Herman, executive secretary of the Douglas County Red Cross Chapter, said Mrs. Britnell had been notified of the meeting by Mrs. Peg Hatfield, regional coordinating council chairman.

An idea for a monthly bulletin for chapter blood recruitment personnel will be developed at the meeting, Mrs. Hatfield said. The bulletin will serve as an exchange medium for successful methods and ideas used in blood recruitment programs.

In summoning Mrs. Britnell to the meeting, Mrs. Hatfield said "a few people from the more success by chapters" will attend the session, scheduled at 10:30 a.m. at the regional blood center. Mrs. Britnell will accompany her husband to Portland.

Oregon Fruit Shipments 2nd Highest Recorded

SALEM — Shipments of Oregon fresh fruits and vegetables during the year ended June 30 totaled 36,302 cars, the second largest total in history, the State Agriculture Department reported.

The record was 40,986 cars shipped in the 1950-51 fiscal year. Potatoes again topped the list with 19,865 cars.

Figures for other commodities are: Pears 5,844 cars, onions 6,162, apples 1,991, prunes 829, corn 133, lettuce 76, tomatoes 10, cherries 135, strawberries 49, walnuts 219, filberts 264, peaches 30, cabbage 126, carrots 28.

Bill Authorizes School For Klamath Reservation

WASHINGTON — The House passed and sent to the Senate a bill authorizing the Indian Bureau to spend \$200,000 to help build a grade school at Chiloquin, Ore., on the Klamath Indian Reservation.

The money is 60 per cent of the estimated cost. The rest is to be put up by the Klamath School District.
