CIO Nips Ruling On Union Activity

WASHINGTON (AP) — A National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) ruling that employers may question workers about union affiliation and activity drew quick criticism Wednesday night from a CIO attorney.

A long-established rule forbidding such questioning was overturned Wednesday by a 3-2 NLRB ruling, which specified that the interrogations are legal if an employer doesn't imply that workers will be subject either to reprisal or benefit because of their answers.

Tom Harris, associate general counsel for the CIO, called the decision "an outrageous backward step." He said it "opens the door to intimidation of workers and to espionage by employers—so long as it is done with a wink in order to satisfy the labor board."
 The majority opinion held that questioning would violate the law if it "reasonably tends to restrain or interfere with" rights guaranteed workers by the Taft-Hartley Labor Relations Act.

Dissenting votes were cast by the two board members appointed by former President Truman.
 The ruling was made in a case involving the Blue Flash Express, Inc., New Orleans, and local 270 of the AFL Teamsters Union. The union accused the firm of unfair labor practices for questioning employees about union membership.

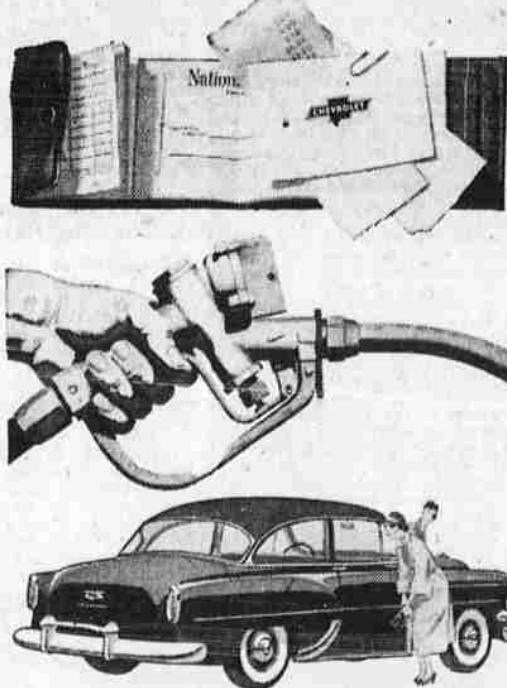
