

Bullet Wound Sends Girl To Hospital Paralyzed

gunshot wound, from a rifle held by her 9-year-old brother, put Beverly Jean Quick, 13, of Meacham, in a hospital in critical condition.

The brother, Larry, was unable to account for the mishap. The two had been out hunting blackbirds and shooting at targets and were returning home Wednesday afternoon, just short of the house, his gun fired as he walked behind and the bullet lodged in the girl's spine.

She has been paralyzed since from the waist down.

The two are children of Mr. and Mrs. Eddie A. Quick.
