Military Housing Measure Passes

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Senate Wednesday passed a bill to authorize construction of 11,967 family housing units for military personnel in this country at a cost of 175 million dollars.

The measure also would authorize construction of military family housing in foreign countries at a cost of 75 million dollars.

The measure, passed by the Senate by voice vote, differs from a House-approved military housing bill in several respects.

The Senate version must be approved by the House or a joint conference committee named to work out a compromise which would have to be approved by both Houses before it goes to the White House.

The Senate's list of projects, the number of units and the amounts recommended to be authorized included:

Oregon: (Air Force) Portland International Airport (50) \$804,000.
Washington: (Army) Ft. Lewis (800) \$10,686,000; (Air Force) Fairchild AFB (5) \$108,000; Larson AFB (5) \$108,000; Paine AFB (70) \$938,700; Geiger Field (50) \$670,500.
