

Talent Irrigation Job Bill Passed By Senate
 WASHINGTON (AP)—A bill to authorize construction of the Talent Division of the Rogue River, Ore., Irrigation Project was passed by the Senate Wednesday and sent to the White House.
 Estimated cost of the work is \$22,775,000. The project would provide water for about 18,000 acres of land, would include a 16,000-horsepower capacity power plant and would provide for rehabilitation work on the Medford and Rogue River Valley irrigation districts.

Handwriting Experts Will Testify In Case
 DALLAS, Ore. (AP) — Two handwriting experts were expected to testify Thursday about the disputed receipt Otto Cahill holds for \$750 in funds of a North Lincoln County water district.
 Cahill is accused of making off with the money. Dist. Atty. William Hollen of Lincoln County contends the signature of the district treasurer was forged on the receipt.
 The treasurer, John Naylor, died last January, at about the time Cahill, secretary of the district, was recalled.
 Naylor's widow testified Wednesday that she had never heard her husband mention that Cahill had turned the money over to him. She said the money was not found in his personal effects or in his bank account.
 The handwriting experts are Stanley MacDonald, Multnomah County criminologist, and Capt. Max Alford of the state police at Salem.
 Hollen said he expects to complete his case Thursday.
 Harry G. Hoy, Cahill's attorney, said he expects to complete the case for the defense in another day.


