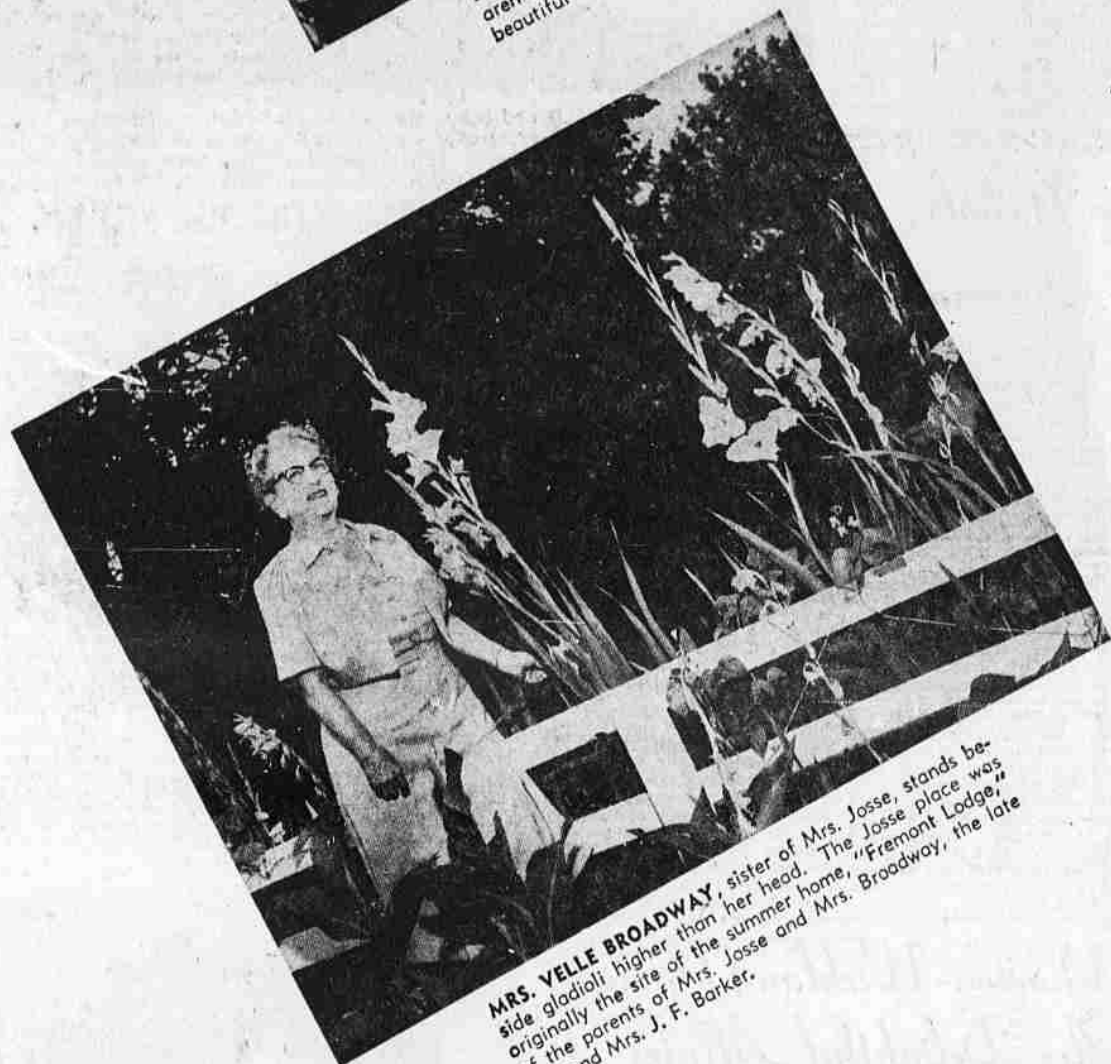


THE JOSSE HOME

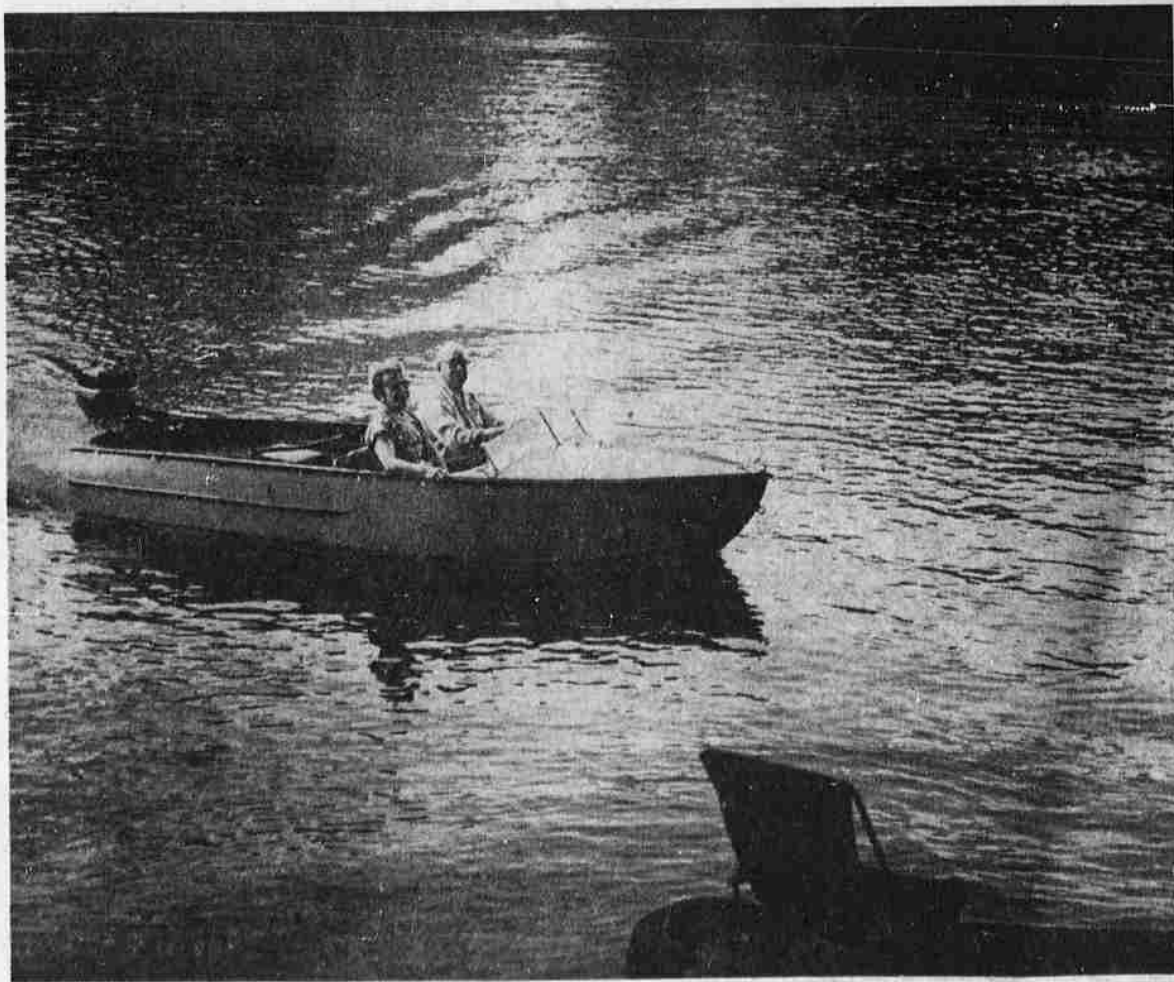
