

Recovery Of Body Reveals Identity

HOPE, B.C. (AP) — Recovery of a body at Choate, 19 miles north of here on the Fraser River, has brought positive identification of the three persons who died July 1 after their car plunged 100 feet into the Thompson River near Spence's bridge.

RCMP Monday said the body recovered Friday night has been positively identified as that of Maurice Fred Fowler, 38, of Alameda, Calif., and Ketchikan, Alaska.

With recovery of Fowler's body, RCMP said they now are certain other occupants of the car were Mildred Fowler, 14, his daughter, and Arnold Kinder, 42, of northern Texas, a friend.

Fowler purchased the car in California and was driving it to Alaska at the time of the plunge off Tank Creek bridge into the Thompson.

RCMP attempted to recover the car immediately after the crash but depth and speed of the river defeated their efforts.

Senators Lehman, McCarthy In Tilt

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate voted Monday to cite Abraham Unger of New York City and Albert Shadowitz of Nutley, N. J., for contempt of the Senate for their refusal to answer questions last year before the investigations subcommittee headed by Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.).

A third citation—against author Corliss Lamont—was pending. McCarthy and Sen. Lehman (D-Lib. N.Y.), engaged in a sharply worded debate over the citations against Unger and Shadowitz and on both Lehman recorded himself as opposed to the action.

At one point in the debate, McCarthy said he was "very, very much disappointed and disturbed to find Communist jargon" used on the floor of the Senate by Lehman in behalf of a man McCarthy termed a "Communist organizer." This man was Unger, who told the subcommittee last September it had "no authority to inquire into the political beliefs and opinions of any person."

Neither Unger nor Shadowitz invoked the Fifth Amendment in their refusal to testify.

Lehman said the Supreme Court would rule soon on the question whether the First Amendment—which guarantees freedom of speech and belief—is a legal safeguard for witnesses before congressional committees who refuse to answer questions.

Some congressional committees recognize only the Fifth Amendment—which protects a witness from compulsory self-incrimination.

Lehman told McCarthy he was "sorry" to have "disappointed" the Wisconsin senator but that he would "continue to seek to protect the civil liberties" of Americans. McCarthy replied tartly that Lehman had not "disappointed" him.

"I said you shocked me," McCarthy said.

McCarthy read the senate a Feb. 16 letter from Deputy Atty. Gen. William P. Rogers on the question of the use of the first amendment as protection against testifying.
