

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP) — Pacific Northwest Pipeline expects to start delivery of gas by late 1955 through a 1,466-mile pipeline from the San Juan Basin to the Pacific Northwest. In a review of plans Tuesday, the company was reported to have scheduled for late 1955 the delivery of gas through the pipeline. C. R. Williams, company president, said Tuesday night this was incorrect; that the proposed delivery starting date is late next year.

Denies Langlie Has Intervened

OLYMPIA (AP) — J. E. Fadling, president of Western Washington District Council 23 of the International Woodworkers of America (IWA), said Wednesday Gov. Langlie has not contacted the IWA in his reported attempt to settle the Northwest lumber strike.

Langlie told reporters Tuesday that either he or Gov. Patterson of Oregon, working together, have been in touch with representatives of both management and labor in an effort to end the strike. Langlie did not say what progress had been made, but reported that he and Patterson were still trying to bring the parties together.

The governor was in Portland Wednesday and could not be reached for comment on Fadling's prepared statement which said:

"While there is considerable talk relative to Gov. Langlie's interest in the strike situation, to this date Gov. Langlie has not contacted the International Woodworkers of America either on an international or district basis.

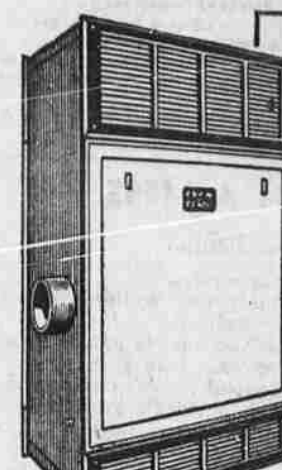
"The union expressed puzzlement relative to Gov. Langlie's apparent lack of concern in the matter of the striking IWA membership in the state of Washington, with membership in the area affected by the strike totaling approximately 20,000.

"The International Woodworkers of America have clearly demon-

strated that they are willing to meet with any group interested in the strike situation."

Langlie told reporters a month ago his offices were open to all interested parties to give whatever assistance it could to end the strike. It was apparently some time after that that representatives of labor and management got in touch with either him or Gov. Patterson.

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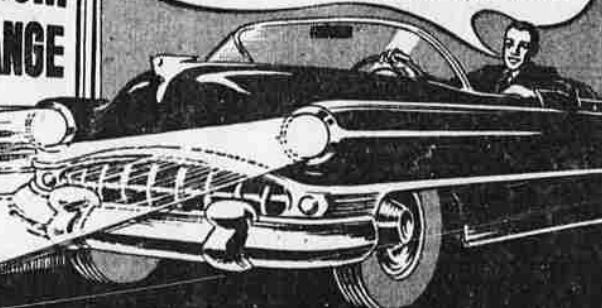
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
