Cottage Grove Plant Found Guilty By Board

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — A National Labor Relations Board trial examiner here has found the Madonna & Arnold Lumber Co., Cottage Grove, Ore., guilty of an unfair labor practice in discharging a CIO employee in July, 1953.

The examiner, Martin S. Bennett, recommended to the NLRB that the company be ordered to reinstate the employee, Forrest Elliott, and to compensate him for any financial loss resulting from his dismissal. He also recommended that the company be compelled to notify employees it will not discourage membership in the CIO Woodworkers Union or any other labor organization.
