Complaints Filed
Arlie A. Frost vs. State Industrial Accident Commission. Plaintiff seeks to have claim remanded to commission and modified to grant compensation for permanent partial disability equal to 100 per cent loss of function of arm, 90 per cent loss of right leg and 40 per cent of left leg. Injured June 8, 1953, when hit by falling tree while working for Morrison-Knudson Co. SIAC previously awarded 50 per cent for arm, 20 per cent for right leg.
