## Says He Saved Many GI's Lives

FT. SHERIDAN, Ill. (AP) — An officer accused of collaborating with the Communists in a North Korean prison camp says his actions saved the lives of many American war prisoners, including some of his accusers.

Lt. Col. Harry Fleming, 46-year-old artillery officer of Racine, Wis., pleaded innocent before an Army general court-martial Friday to charges that he "wrongfully col-

laborated with the enemy and committed acts detrimental to fellow prisoners of war" during three years in a Red POW camp. The specifications presented at the opening of the court alleged that Fleming informed on other prisoners, led Communist discussion groups in camp, made broadcasts for the Reds and "willfully stepped on the foot" of another prisoner, an enlisted man.

The 11-officer court recessed until Monday after hearing Fleming's plea of innocence. During a recess, Fleming, a slightly built man with close-cropped grey hair and four rows of ribbons on his dress uniform, said to newsmen: "None of my accusers ever had guts enough to meet me face to face until now. What I did, I did for the benefit of all in camp. 'Many of those who came back alive, as well as some of my accusers, would be buried in a Korean hillside except for some of the policies I went through with. I can definitely show, through witnesses, that their lives were saved.'"

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## Mrs. Thorne Commences Court Suit On Son's Will

CHICAGO (AP) — The anticipated court fight over the \$1,800,000 estate of the late Montgomery Ward Thorne has been started by his mother. Mrs. Marion Thorne, mother of the 20-year-old heir to a mail order fortune, charged his fiancée and prospective mother-in-law with having exercised "domination and undue influence" over him in the making of his last will.

In a Circuit Court suit, Mrs. Thorne sought to set aside the will made by her son June 10, nine days before he was found dead in his North Side apartment.

In the will, Thorne left one half of his estate to Miss Ragen, one fourth to her mother Mrs. Aleen Ragen, one eighth to an aunt and one eighth to his mother. In an earlier will he had left the entire estate to his mother.

## Newbury Takes No Action On Democrats' Charges

SALEM (AP) — Secretary of State Earl T. Newbury said Friday he plans to take no action on two complaints by State Democratic Chairman Howard Morgan that Republicans violated the Corrupt Practices Act.

Morgan charged that the Republican National Committee should have made a report on expenses of a television speech of Interior Secretary McKay last May 10, and that U. S. Sen. Guy Cordon should have listed a \$5,000 loan made to him by David B. Simpson.

Newbury said that since there are no violations of the law, there is nothing to lay before the district attorney. "I am convinced that McKay's speech was not made for political purposes, but that it was a frank report to the people, of some of the violations of the law, there is nothing to lay before the district attorney."
