Pentagon Says 15 Americans Held Prisoners

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States Thursday formally charged the Chinese Communists are holding 15 American airmen as political prisoners.

A Defense Department statement said the Chinese Communists admitted at the recent conference at Geneva that the 15 are alive and that this has been verified by American, former prisoners of war, who have been exchanged since the end of the war in Korea.

The Pentagon announcement said also that the Communists have been asked to account for a total of 536 Americans who are either in Communist hands or concerning whose fate the Communists have knowledge, as indicated in an announcement by the Far East command in Korea on Tuesday.

The 15 airmen are alleged by the Communists to have flown over neutral territory during the Korean War. The Reds contend they were shot down or forced to land in Manchuria on the north side of the Yalu River.

The names of the 15 have previously been released by the Defense Department. But until Thursday's statement, the United States has qualified its inquiries about the men by saying that the information about them had stemmed solely from authenticated Communist sources.

The Defense Department announcement charged the Communists with adopting the subterfuge of classifying prisoners of war as political prisoners to evade the armistice agreement.

The agreement provided that all prisoners desiring repatriation would be returned to the side of their choice. The Pentagon statement said the 15 airmen were not given an opportunity to be repatriated.

Dulles Considers Japan Stopover From Conference

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State Dulles was reported Thursday considering a brief stopover in Japan on his way back next month from a conference in the Philippines to visit an eight-nation Southeast Asia defense alliance.

The purpose apparently would be to reassure Japanese leaders who have voiced qualms about their country's ability to get along without trading with the Communists.

Dulles, who already has traveled more than 100,000 miles in less than two years, is scheduled to leave for the Philippines early in September.

Before the Asia defense talks open, the secretary has an appointment Sept. 4 at Manila with Carlos Garcia, Philippines vice president, and foreign minister.

Their task is to organize the U. S., Philippines defense council under the mutual defense pact recently negotiated between the two countries.

At the conference two days later, Dulles will meet with foreign ministers or their representatives from Britain, France, Australia, New Zealand, Thailand, the Philippines and Pakistan.

Working groups of all eight countries already have done much of the preliminary writing of the treaty, which is expected to resemble closely the U. S.-Philippines arrangement and the Anzus pact among Australia, New Zealand and the United States.

Only 9 Of Oregon's 36 Counties Are In Debt

SALEM (AP) — Only nine of Oregon's 36 counties are in debt, State Treasurer Sig Unander said Monday.

Their total debt on July 1 was \$11,071,921, compared with \$6,079,397 two years ago.

The increase is due to the fact that Umatilla and Wasco counties issued bridge revenue bonds totaling \$8,650,000.

The debt by counties: Coos \$270,568, Curry \$1,852, Grant \$471, Klamath \$10,000, Morrow \$5,500, Multnomah \$2,174,918, Umatilla \$5,100,000, Wasco, \$3,428,250, and Washington \$95,850.

Unander said that Klamath and Morrow counties have enough cash on hand to pay off their debt.

Hydrogen Blast On Coulee Dam Effects Visioned

OLYMPIA (AP) — If an enemy bomb should knock out Grand Coulee Dam, what would happen to the Pacific Northwest?

It probably would be the greatest flood disaster ever to hit this country, civil defense officials believe, and that's why the Washington Department of Civil Defense will hold a test called "Operation Floodout" Monday.

Destruction of the 550-foot-high dam by an H-bomb would unleash a torrent or radiologically poisoned water that would cause evacuation of 74,000 persons and cripple traffic and power production, the officials estimate.

Downstream cities probably would have plenty of warning before the flood struck, but the flooding would be greater than any known in the Columbia Basin.

Bridgeport, three miles below the dam would have three hours warning, Wenatchee 11 hours, Richland 21 hours and Portland 45 hours.

But the water would rise 875 feet over sea level at Bridgeport, and even at Portland it would be 53 feet above sea level. That would be 36 feet higher than the crest of the 1948 flood, the most damaging of modern times. It would put water stories deep around the Multnomah Hotel in downtown Portland. Even at the sea the crest would be 20 feet high. It would be days before the river could get back to normal.

The officials also estimate that only one bridge across the Columbia River would remain usable. That is the Bridge of the Gods at Cascade Locks.

Yanks Must Pay Japs For Watermelon Raid

TOKYO (AP) — The U. S. Army, taking issue with some Japanese farmers, said today its paratroopers did only \$36 worth of damage to watermelon crops on a recent test drop including the ones the soldiers ate.

The farmers had claimed the soldiers had eaten and otherwise damaged \$360 worth.

The Army said every company in the 187th Airborne Regiment that made the drop will be held equally responsible for the watermelons and will chip in to repay the farmers.

Sheppard Pleads Innocent To Murder Of Wife

CLEVELAND (AP) — Dr. Samuel H. Sheppard pleaded innocent at his arraignment Friday and his counsel in a surprise move made no request for bail.

William J. Corrigan, head of the defendant's legal staff, previously said he would ask Common Pleas Judge Arthur H. Day to set bail or call a hearing.

Corrigan made no mention of the matter at the arraignment queried by reporters, he snapped: "No comment. I'm not trying this case in the newspapers."

Dressed nattily in a charcoal grey suit, Dr. Sheppard was accompanied by Corrigan and his counsel, Fred H. Garmone, as he stepped before the bench to enter a plea to the first degree murder indictment.

After the indictment was read, Garmone said simply "Not guilty, your honor."

Battleship Oregon's Mast To Be Removed

PORTLAND (AP) — A Portland landmark—the mast of the famed Battleship Oregon—is going to be moved to make way for traffic. It was set up on the bank of the Willamette River at the foot of Clay Street during World War II when the battleship was moved from its moorage nearby. A cloverleaf for the Hawthorne Bridge will use this spot.

The new site will be on a landscaped area bounded by Front Avenue, Harbor Drive, Oak and Pine streets, downstream from the present site.
