Alton and Gertrude Hebard have purchased a 514 acre stock ranch in Garden Valley where, with their two sons, they plan to make their home.

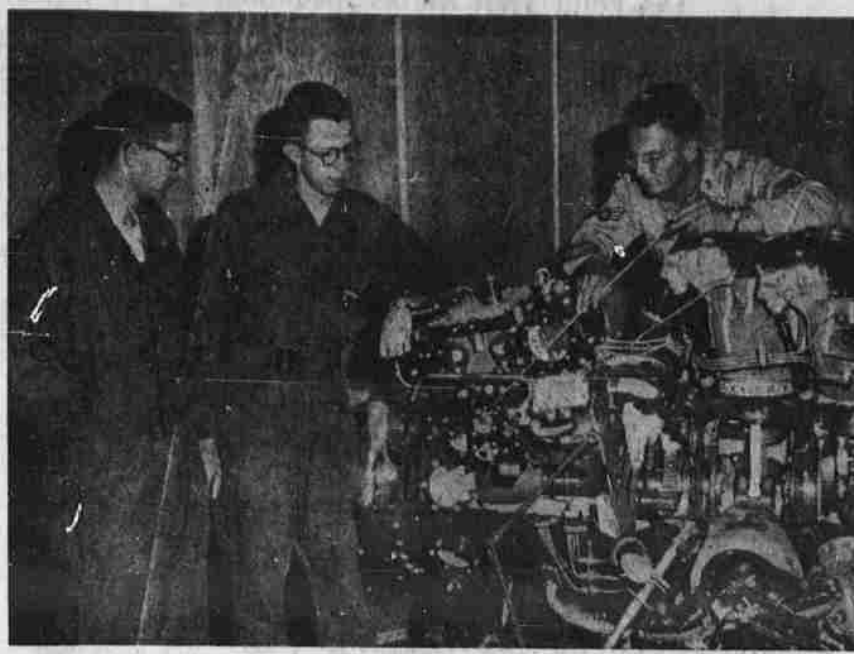
Return To Nevada

NUT GROWERS ADVISED
PORTLAND, Aug. 27.—Oregon nut growers, faced with a late harvest, Monday were urged to ship their crops piecemeal.

John Trunk, general manager of the Northwest Nut Growers, said that would be necessary if growers were to get their products to Eastern centers in time for the holiday trade.

The filbert harvest is expected in the first week of October and about Nov. 1, he said.

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Eisenhower To Defer Claims To Antarctic

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27.—President Eisenhower reportedly has decided to defer any formal claim by the United States to territory in the antarctic.

Informed officials said Tuesday the President thus went against an interdepartmental recommendation that such a claim be made. Eisenhower was represented, however, as feeling the United States should continue to insist on its rights in the south polar region, where Americans such as Rear Adm. Richard E. Byrd have explored.

Longstanding U. S. policy is to withhold recognition of other nation's claims in the antarctic and to reserve American rights there.

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
