Murray Assails As Anti-Labor NLRB Decisions

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Murray (D-Mont.) assailed as "anti-labor" several recent decisions handed down by the National Labor Relations Board and predicted one of them would take labor "back to the days of the yellow dog contract."

Murray, senior Democrat on the Senate Labor Committee, led a losing fight last winter against confirmation of Albert C. Reeson, the third Eisenhower administration nominee on the five-member board.

Sen. Ives (R-N.Y.), also a Labor committee member, disagreed sharply with Murray's analysis of recent NLRB decisions. He said in a separate interview: "The NLRB under the New and 'Fair Deals' tended to reflect the position of organized labor in many respects. The present board, with three of its five members named by President Eisenhower, seems to be trying to strike a balance between the powerful pressures of labor and management."

The disagreement between the two senators underlined difficulties Eisenhower may run into if, as he says he will, he asks Congress anew for Taft-Hartley labor law revisions next year.

Hungary Agrees To Say Flood Relief From U.S.

BUDAPEST, Hungary (AP) — Hungary has agreed that the aid the United States is sending to the 40,000 to 50,000 flood victims in this Communist country will bear Red Cross markings and the label: "Gift of the American People."

An agreement was signed with the International Red Cross for distribution of the food medicine and other supplies offered by President Eisenhower on July 20.

Accountant Tells Of Collecting Revenue Refunds

PORTLAND (AP) — James L. Proctor II, 27-year-old Vancouver, Wash., accountant, Tuesday revealed how he had collected nearly \$10,000 from the Internal Revenue Bureau by sending in phony claims for income tax overpayments.

Proctor, married and the father of one child, was accused of violating internal revenue laws and of forgery. He waived preliminary hearing and was held in jail in lieu of \$15,000 bond.

John L. Savage, chief of intelligence for the Internal Revenue Bureau here, said Proctor told this story:

He studied accounting at the University of Washington some years ago and last February got a job at the Portland Internal Revenue Bureau office. He quit after nine days and beginning about Feb. 12, he started mailing out income tax returns—35 of them—to different internal revenue district offices. Each of the returns claimed a \$50 refund and was signed Allan Carl Adams, with the address of a Carl Adams—taken from a phone book—in each of the cities to which he mailed the return. He said he was in Portland temporarily and that the refund checks should be sent here.

Savage said, "It had to be cleverly worked and he did it cleverly. But it's hazardous and I feel pretty sure we will pick up anyone trying it."

U.S. To Draw Deadly Sabres Out Of Korea

SEOUL (AP) — The U.S. 5th Air Force announced Friday plans to pull many of its deadly Sabre jets and other planes out of Korea and shift its headquarters to Nagoya, Japan.

When the Korean armistice was signed 13 months ago the 5th Air Force was flying more than 1,000 planes.

Announcement of plans to base many of these planes elsewhere follows by only a few days disclosure that four of six U. S. Infantry divisions now in Korea are to be withdrawn. Experts said the Army-Air Force withdrawal will pull at least 100,000 Americans out of Korea.

The Air Force did not identify units which will be pulled out. It said some will be based elsewhere in the Far East, while others will return to the United States in a major reshuffle expected to start soon and continue for several months.
