

School Landscaping Work Is Begun At Glendale

Work has reached the landscaping stage at Glendale's new high school, according to Correspondent Mrs. Gerald B. Fox.

Installation of new sidewalks and curbs has started and a contract for leveling the grounds and planting grass has been let to Archie Morgan. The leveling and planting will start when cement work has been completed. Meanwhile, blueprints for bleachers and lighting system for the baseball and football field have been drawn up by Clair Hamlin, Eugene, architect who designed the school itself. Bleacher seating capacities at each of the fields will be about 1,000. Bids for installation of the facilities are still being accepted.

Red Threat Grows, U. S. Admiral Says

WASHINGTON (AP) — Adm. Arthur W. Radford, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, said Monday the military forces of communism pose "a very considerable and rapidly growing menace" to the United States and the rest of the free world.

Radford told the American Legion convention, in a prepared address, this country still stands on the "massive retaliation" policy announced by Secretary of State Dulles as the best way to counter the Communist threat.

He said this does not mean, however, the United States is committed to any particular form of action — such as resort to the hydrogen bomb — in the event of new Red aggression. Radford said U. S. military planners have a double-barreled problem: "We must be ready for tremendous counteroffensive blows in event of a global war; and we must be ready for lesser military actions in local hot spots."

New York Leads States In Number Of Veterans

WASHINGTON (AP) — New York State had an estimated 2,080,000 veterans on June 30 to lead all states, statistics of the Veterans Administration showed Monday.

There were an estimated 20,850,000 veterans of all wars living on June 30, with 20,662,000 of them in the continental United States. Another 143,000 resided in U. S. territories and possessions and 45,000 were in foreign countries. Other totals by states included: Oregon 235,000 and Washington 337,000.

US Home Market OK, Cordon Says

KLAMATH FALLS (AP) — Sen. Guy Cordon carried his campaign for re-election to Klamath Falls Monday and told a breakfast conference that the nation's domestic market is as good now "as ever existed."

Cordon added, however, a hope that changes will be made to give farmers a "break" in the foreign market. The senator called "purveyors of doom and gloom" those who fear a farm depression because of lower price supports and reduced acreages. He said these predictions are made by job seekers who "never understand" their case. Cordon said he would prefer to see a two-price system for wheat, one on supplies used for human consumption and the other for wheat used for all other purposes. The senator also had speaking engagements at Bly and Lakeview during the day.
