

U.S. To Increase Planes In Europe

WASHINGTON — American air power in Europe will be increased under a plan announced today to rotate tactical Air Force units for temporary tours of duty on the Continent.

The program, starting in the next few weeks, will send squadrons of Air Force fighter-bombers, which are used for the support of ground forces, and the troop carrier outfits overseas under a schedule similar to that which has been in use for several years by the Strategic Air Command's force of long-range bombers.

The official announcement said the rotation plan was to test the mobility of fighter-bomber and troop carrier units, and to "afford crew members the opportunity to obtain valuable experience and indoctrination in tactical Air Force operations in the European area."

The Air Force didn't say so, but the presence of additional squadrons under a schedule which will keep several on the scene at all times also means a net increase for air strength in Europe.

Puerto Ricans All Plead Guilty

NEW YORK — Guilty pleas have been entered by four of 17 Puerto Rican nationalists scheduled to be tried on charges of conspiracy to overthrow the United States government by force and violence, U.S. Atty. J. Edward Lumbard, announced Tuesday.

Lumbard said the 13 still facing trial include four already under heavy sentence for shooting up the House of Representatives last March 1.

Lumbard said the four who pleaded guilty Friday are Carlos Aulet, Ange Luis Medina, and Gonzalo Lebron Sotomayor, all of Chicago; and Francisco Cortes Ruiz, of Ponce, Puerto Rico.

Lumbard said those who pleaded guilty could be sentenced to six years imprisonment and fined \$10,000 each.

Sotomayor is a brother of Dolores (Lolita) Lebron, who has been sentenced to from 18 to 50 years for her part in the Washington shootings in which five congressmen were wounded.

Gov. Patterson Requests Emergency Timber Sales

SALEM — Gov. Paul L. Patterson asked the federal government Tuesday to make emergency timber sales to keep Oregon's 75,000 lumber and logging workers busy next winter.

Pointing out that the prolonged lumber strike has depleted the log supply to keep the mills running next winter, the governor also said that many small sales in the next 30 to 45 days would also speed up salvage of timber killed by fire, insects and wind.

The governor's telegram went to Secretary of Agriculture Benson, who runs the Forest Service; and Secretary of the Interior, McCarver, who administers Oregon's California grant lands.

The governor also suggested that the sales be made in places where roads can be built easily.

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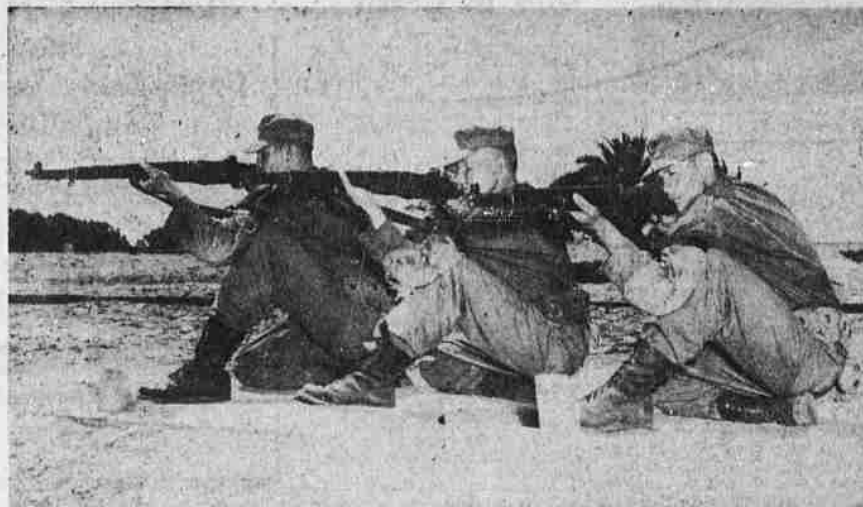

Veterinarian Develops Control For Erysipelas

Immunization of turkeys against erysipelas looks promising for control of the infectious disease that costs Oregon's turkey industry up to \$150,000 annually, according to Dr. E. M. Dickinson, Oregon State College poultry veterinarian.

Dr. Dickinson has completed three-year trials with a new bacterin that immunizes birds for two to three months following inoculation. Turkey growers can get the bacterin, syringe, and instructions for inoculating birds from veterinarians, biological supply houses, and some feed stores.

Turkeys inoculated at six to eight weeks of age in OSC trials were immune to the disease for about 90 days. Immunization lasted only 60 days, however, when birds were 12 or more weeks old at the time of inoculation.

This year's turkey crop will, in most cases, reach the ideal marketing age of eight to twelve weeks in August or September and should remain immune until slaughter. Hence and toms held over as breeders should be inoculated a second time when they are selected.

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President Eisenhower Fine After Night In Hospital

DENVER — President Eisenhower returned to his summer white house desk with a cheery "Good Morning" Tuesday after an overnight stay in the hospital for his annual physical checkup.

"Oh boy, I had a big sleep last night," the smiling President remarked as he stepped from his car at the Lowry Air Force Base administration building.

James C. Hagerty, White House press secretary, told newsmen Eisenhower got a very "favorable" preliminary report on his condition at the hospital, but added that the chief executive will not receive a final detailed report for several days.

Shortly before noon the President awarded the Medal of Honor, the nation's highest military decoration, to two Army heroes of the Korean War.

The medals were conferred on Infantry 1st Lt. Benjamin F. Wilson, 33, of Vashon, Wash., and medical corps Master Sgt. Ola L. Mize, 28, of Gadsden, Ala. Both

men appeared nervous as they stood at attention before the President, their commander-in-chief.

Mize is the 70th veteran of the Korean War to win the medal. Wilson is the 72nd. Close relatives of both men were invited to the summer white house to witness the award ceremony.

The citation accompanying Wilson's medal praises him for "sustained valor and intrepid actions" which "reflect utmost credit upon himself and uphold the honored traditions of the military service."

It added that on June 5, 1951 in Korea he was twice wounded in action near Hwach' On - Myon. During an enemy counterattack, the citation says, Wilson charged the enemy ranks and fought valiantly, killing three enemy soldiers with his rifle before it was wrested from his hands, and annihilating four others with his entrenching tool.

Mize is cited for gallantry in action on June 10-11 near Surang-Ni in Korea.

For the first time, the prize winners aren't forced to sell their animals.



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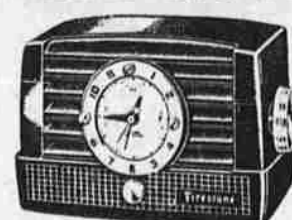
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
