WASHINGTON (AP)—Congress members will have their own special prayer room in the capitol when they reconvene in January. The small room, intended only for individual use, will house no special services nor will it be a chapel in the usual sense.

Rep. Hays (D-Ark), author of the resolution which authorized its preparation, said it will be suitable for Protestant, Catholic and Jewish members.

Its central feature will be a stained glass window "of subdued colors and magnificent design." It is the gift of a Los Angeles firm and its workmen.

**Patron Saint's Blood Keeps Birthday Custom**

NAPLES, Italy (AP)—Catholic Neapolitans looked forward to good times and rejoiced today following an announcement that the hardened blood of the city's patron, St. Januarius, had turned to liquid on his birthdays, as in centuries past. The blood is kept in two silver phials in the Naples Cathedral. Thousands crowded into the cathedral yesterday as priests removed the containers from a silver safe and placed them at the altar. They announced that the blood softened 38 minutes after the ceremony opened.

For four centuries, the church says, the blood has flowed three times a year—on the first Saturday of May, Sept. 1 and Dec. 16. Only three times it remained hard. This was before the bubonic plague in 1357, a cholera epidemic in 1884 and the 1944 eruption of Vesuvius.

**Swedish Government Unchanged By Election**

STOCKHOLM (AP)—Sweden's governing coalition of Socialists and Agrarians remained solidly entrenched today following weekend local elections but both the government parties lost some ground. The Conservatives, the country's third largest party, scored the largest gains. The Communists held steady, in last place with only 4.9 per cent of the 3,701,541 ballots cast. Prime Minister Tage Erlander in a statement said the outcome in the voting would "bring no change in the policy of the Swedish government."

**Tito Opposes NATO As Member But States He Would Cooperate**

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia (AP)—President Tito says Yugoslavia should apply any invitations to join NATO because the Atlantic pact "is increasingly assuming a political hue—a struggle against communism."

"We are painted a Socialist hue," he told a rally, and "there is no place for us in a bloc which has an anti-Socialist tendency."

He added, however, that cooperation with the North Atlantic Treaty Organization was possible and would be continued by his government. In addition to receiving Western military aid, Yugoslavia is allied in a mutual defense pact with Greece and Turkey, both NATO members.

Referring to his Communist regime's relations with Iron Curtain countries, Tito said he would "gladly accept any gesture of good will" by Russia.

Yugoslavia has been at odds with the Soviets and their satellites since Tito broke with the Cominform in 1948, but he has remained a staunch Communist.

American informants in Rome pointed out that the Yugoslav leader's apparent overture to the Kremlin did not indicate a switch in policy as he had made similar statements before. The sources said Tito has not softened toward Moscow, but actually has turned his back on recent Russian friendship gestures because he feels the Kremlin still wants to interfere in the internal affairs of nations which come into its orbit.

**Truck Smashes Sign, 'Next Time Take Train'**

SYLMAR, Calif. (AP)—The driver and his passenger escaped serious injury when a heavy truck and trailer roared out of control down the Ridge Route, smashed through a billboard, hit three unoccupied cars and overturned near a motel. Kermit Anderson, 27, the driver, and Leland Keller, 23, both of Dallas, were treated for minor injuries. Anderson told police he lost control of his vehicle load with 17 tons of lemons, when he attempted to shift to a lower gear. The billboard the truck smashed read: "Next time take the train."
