Costello To Rule On Extra Time In Canyon Case

WASHINGTON (AP)—William J. Costello, examiner for the Federal Power Commission, said Wednesday he will rule next week on a request of a Power Commission attorney for an extra month to prepare arguments in the Hells Canyon case.

Attorney John C. Mason Tuesday requested the deadline for filing briefs in the controversial case be set back from Oct. 11 to Nov. 10.

Costello said he will rule after hearing from the Idaho Power Co., which has applied for a permit to build three dams on the Snake River between Idaho and Oregon, and the National Hells Canyon Assn. The latter organization opposed the power company in a year-long hearing conducted by Costello and supported a proposal to build a federal dam in Hells Canyon near one of the sites sought by Idaho Power.

In applying for additional time, Mason said commission attorneys and engineers would not be able to wind up work on their brief by Oct. 11.

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Judy Garland Stages Comeback

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Judy Garland's comeback was complete today as a star-packed first night audience and critics hailed her new movie.

The little girl with the big voice, considered washed up in pictures four years ago, scored a personal triumph at the world premiere of "A Star Is Born" Wednesday night. Her arrival was given a hysterical reception by fans at the Hollywood Pantages theater and most of the first nighters agreed she is a shoe-in for an Oscar next March.

Arriving with husband Sid Luft, who produced the picture, Judy looked radiant in a black velvet gown with jeweled collar and cap. She greeted friends, posed for photos and admitted she was "happy but nervous." She added: "I'll be glad when it's all over with."

She was a far cry from the Judy whose tantrums led to an end of her long MGM contract. She started the comeback trail with her hit at New York's vaudeville shrine, the Palace. Warner Bros. agreed to star her in a remake of the 1937 classic, "A Star Is Born." The film had a stormy history and the bill mounted to a whopping six million. Critics agreed it was worth it.

Attorney Challenges Law On Possession Of Gold

PORTLAND (AP)—A Portland attorney Thursday challenged the legality of a 1933 presidential order outlawing the possession of gold.

That was one of the arguments advanced by Norman L. Easley, who is defending Woodrow W. Atwood of Medford on a charge of illegal possession of gold bullion.

Atwood and another Medford man, Stephen G. Crippen, pleaded guilty to the charge on Aug. 3. A third man Wilbur M. Walls, Portland, pleaded innocent and is awaiting trial.

Easley filed a motion in federal court here, stating that Secret Service men had wrongly persuaded Atwood to plead guilty, and that the present law and directive concerning possession of gold are unconstitutional.
