## Benson Says U. S. Ready To Sell Surplus Abroad

DENVER — Secretary of Agriculture Benson reported to President Eisenhower Thursday that the United States is ready to sell abroad the first 384 million dollars worth of surplus farm crops under a new disposal program.

Benson conferred with the chief executive at his vacation headquarters here and told newsmen afterward that sales negotiations are underway with several friendly countries, and that he expects the first transactions to be completed within the next few days.

At the last session, Congress enacted a law authorizing the sales of 700 million dollars worth of surplus commodities during the next three years. The law also provides for giving away an additional 300 million dollars worth to countries hit by famine or other disaster.

Benson said the first negotiations for sale of surplus are underway with such countries as the United Kingdom, Spain, Yugoslavia, India and Japan.

Of the 384 million dollars in surplus involved in the initial negotiations, 143 million is in bread grains, 87 million in cotton, and 50 million in fats and oils, the secretary said.

He added that under the policy terms recently set forth by the President, the Agriculture Department is trying to work out the sales at competitive world prices to avoid any disruption of the market.

Benson also announced that the Agriculture Department plans to announce within the next few days price support levels for the 1955 wool crop. The support program will be in line with another new law enacted by Congress at the last session.

## Aged Man Struck By Car While Riding Bicycle

PORTLAND — Milton H. Tower, 87, is being treated at a Portland hospital for injuries suffered when a car hit his bicycle.

It was the third such accident in the past three years for Tower, who said he had been riding a bicycle ever since he was a child. "Guess I'm just too old to be riding my wheel," he said. But the policemen who took my wheel over to the station after the accident said I could have it back when I got out of the hospital.

Tower suffered a broken hip and face cuts in the mishap which occurred as he was riding to visit his wife in a nursing home.

## Farm Product Prices Decline Two Per Cent

WASHINGTON — The Agriculture Department reported Thursday farm product prices declined 2 per cent between mid-August and mid-September. They had increased a similar amount a month earlier.

Among commodities which declined were hogs, commercial vegetables, eggs, potatoes, soybeans and chickens. Somewhat higher prices were reported for milk, apples, cotton, cattle, tobacco and wheat.

The farm price level in mid-September was about 4.4 per cent below that of a year earlier and about 21 per cent below the record high reached in February 1951.

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
