Marilyn slept alone last night in the \$1,000-a-month Beverly Hills home that she and Joe rented. She planned to report for work on her picture at 9 a.m.
DiMaggio left her Wednesday in about as final a departure as Hollywood ever has seen. He came out of the house with his bags packed and a grim smile on his face.
Marilyn, for the first time, lost her composure before the press yesterday and had nothing to say. She sobbed almost to the point of collapse. Some cynics called them phony tears but Marilyn would be the first to admit that she isn't a good enough actress to play the scene the way it was played.
Her departure from the house was billed as a return to work but actually it never was intended to be. She wasn't in the mood to play comedy and after a five-minute drive to lawyer Jerry Geisler's office, she returned home.
Joe said as he drove off for San Francisco in his Cadillac:
"San Francisco always has been my home."
