Test Pilot Who Shot Down Four Zeros Killed

LANCASTER, Calif. (AP) — Chief test pilot George Welch of North American Aviation Inc., who shot down four Japanese Zeros during the attack on Pearl Harbor, was fatally injured Tuesday when his F100 Super Sabre exploded.

Witnesses said his jet fighter plane appeared to blow up. North American reported Welch had radioed that he was going into a dive shortly before the accident.

Welch, who did most of the testing of the F100, the first operational fighter plane capable of supersonic level flight, parachuted.

He landed in a field and was flown to Edwards Air Force Base by helicopter. Officers there said he was dead on arrival.

Knowland Stumps Oregon In Favor Of Sen. Cordon

Sen. William Knowland of California, majority leader of the U. S. Senate, was in Oregon Tuesday campaigning for Sen. Guy Cordon and other Republican congressional candidates.

Knowland told reporters on his arrival at the Portland airport Monday evening that Oregon and the nation could "ill afford" to lose Cordon from the Senate. He said the Pacific Northwest had benefited from Cordon's seniority on various committees.

Discussing national affairs, the majority leader said he did not think there was a growing hostility in the United States toward the United Nations. He added that this country could no more return to isolationism than an "adult can become a child again."

Knowland has scheduled talks at rallies in Salem, Molalla and Oregon City Wednesday. That afternoon he is to appear at Vancouver, Wash., and later in the day will return to Portland for a television talk and a dinner meeting.

Meantime Cordon carried his campaign in the Springfield area where he elaborated on his views on timber cutting. He said Richard L. Neuberger, his Democratic opponent, would have voters believe that Cordon favored cutting timber in national parks.

Cordon said that was not so. He said ripe timber should be cut to prevent economic loss and that he was talking about "national forests where there is room for all."

"If I had to make a choice—and I don't have to make it, thank God—and it was between a camping site for eastern visitors or grub for Oregon kids, I got her made," Cordon declared.

"You can't have a lumber industry if you don't cut trees," the senator added.

Republican Gov. Paul Patterson, who is campaigning for re-election, spoke Monday to the Portland Chamber of Commerce.

Sec. Dulles Sees Hope In Trieste Settlement

NEW YORK (AP) — Secretary of State Cordell Hull sees the Trieste settlement as an example that "will have a profound influence on other problems which ought to be resolved in the same spirit."

The long and bitter Trieste dispute between Yugoslavia and Italy was ended last week by partition of the disputed territory.

Dulles Monday night told an Italian-American Columbus Day dinner, "It seemed for a time that problem was unsolvable because both in Italy and in Yugoslavia emotion ran so high that there was danger it would stifle the voice of reason."

The settlement, he continued, demonstrated "above all...the capacity for the nations which are free of Soviet domination to re-
