

Budget Request Shows Deficit Of \$36,600,000

SALEM (AP)—Gov. Paul Patterson's budget for the two years beginning next July 1 will show a maximum deficit of \$36,600,000, the State Budget Division and State Tax Commission has estimated.

The maximum deficit in the budget for regular appropriations would be \$22,000,000, plus \$14,600,000 if requests for new institution and college buildings are included.

State Finance Director Harry S. Dorman said the deficit figure was arrived at by subtracting requests by state departments from the estimated tax receipts in the next

Budget Division probably will reduce the deficit slightly by trimming the departmental requests.

What the report means is that the Legislature will be forced to find some new tax revenue to balance the budget. It is doubtful that expenditures could be cut by anywhere near the amount of the budget, unless drastic cuts were made in the amount of money given for education and public welfare.

The Tax Commission estimated that total tax receipts in the next

estimated tax receipts for the next two-year period.

He said, however, that the biennium would be \$178,500,000. The budget requests of state departments total \$208,500,000.

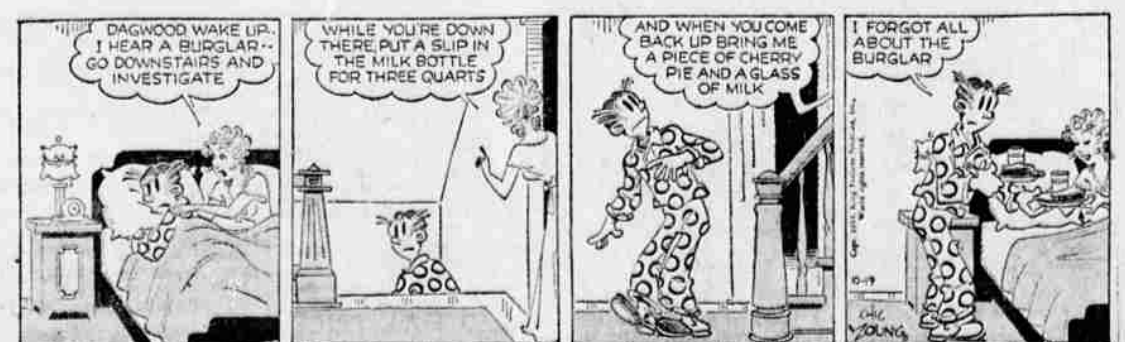
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
