Spend Day in Eugene — Mrs. B. A. Young and son, Bernie, of Roseburg spent Tuesday in Eugene on business.

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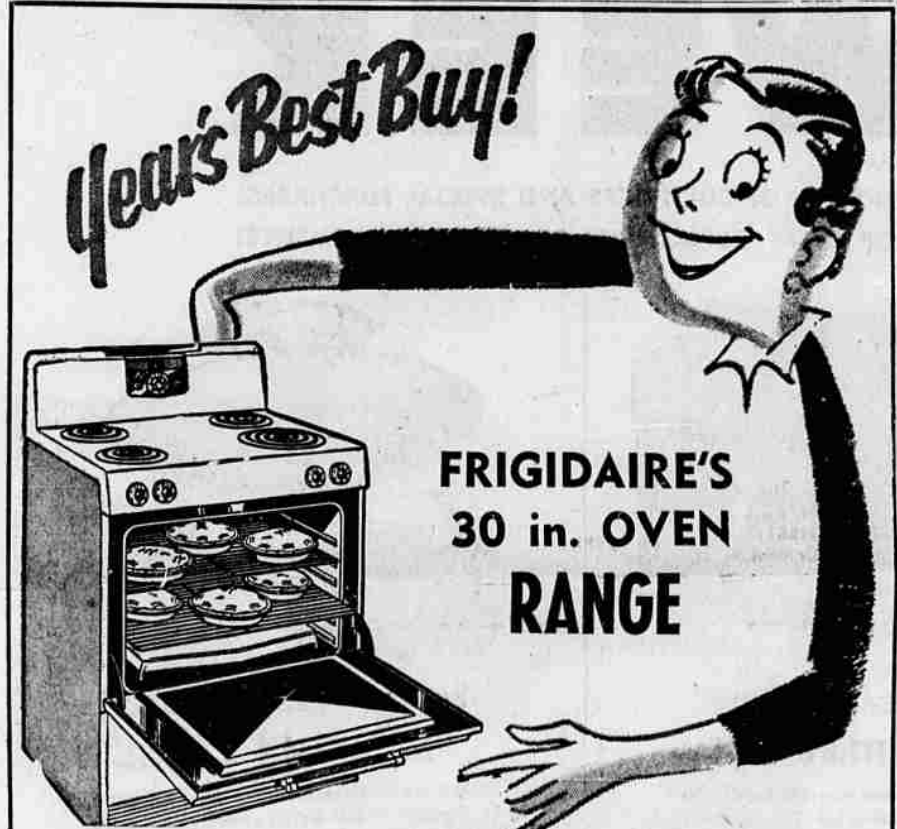
