50 New Phones In At Glendale

The Glendale Telephone Co. has installed about 50 new phones since the system was switched over to automatic dial operation Sept. 18.

Bob Jones, manager of the Glendale Telephone Co. further stated that he has 60 new telephones on order, and service requests are now on file for more than 50 of them. Jones expects early delivery on the new phones but has no definite word as to shipping date.

Installation was completed this week on tape interceptor which causes a tape-recorded voice to answer when a discontinued or changed number is dialed. The recording informs the customer that the number is no longer listed and suggests that the caller either re-check the number or ask the operator for assistance.

Another improvement on the service offered by the company was the completion, about a week ago, of the hook-up of a second trunk line between Glendale and Azalea. The new system offers one trunk line for calls from Glendale to Azalea and another for calls from Azalea to Glendale, and will thus cut down congestion of calls.

Government Runs Nearly \$5 Billion In Red

WASHINGTON (AP)—The government ran nearly five billion dollars in the red in the three months ending Sept. 30.
The period was the first quarter of the 1955 fiscal year, which began last July 1, and the deficit for the three months was a little bigger than was predicted for the entire year when budget figures were revised in September.
However, the first half of each fiscal year—from July through December—is a time of low tax receipts and always piles up a deficit. It is then cut back sharply from January through June—months when tax receipts are bigger than spending.
