

Portland Heavyweight Posts 12th Straight KO Over San Diego Fighter

PORTLAND (AP) — Jimmy Byrne of Portland floored Kirby Seals of San Diego in the sixth round of their scheduled 10-round heavyweight boxing match Thursday night and dropped him for the 10-count in the seventh.

Torio upset ex-Olympic star Jim LaRock last week at the Armory and in addition has a win over Poffo to his credit. His opponent, popular O'Rourke, has been reportedly making a big hit on TV in Portland and has improved in all phases of the game.
