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Back From Portland — Mr. and Mrs. Fred Hamilton returned to their home in Roseburg Tuesday, following several days in Portland on business.

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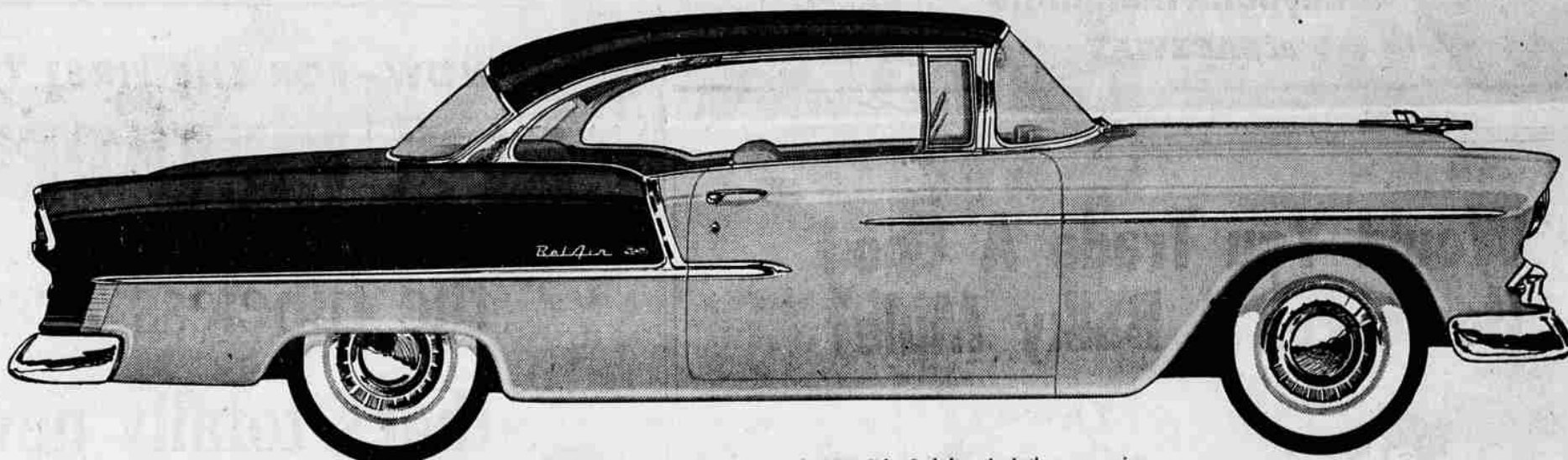
