"LET'S LOOK AT THE RECORD" OF STATE SENATOR RICHARD L. NEUBERGER

The Forty-Seventh Legislative Assembly Of Oregon --- 1953 Session

A study of the subject matter of the bills on which State Senator Neuberger did not take the trouble to vote, will show that among such bills were many on subjects in which he professed great interest in past and present published remarks.

The 1953 Legislature convened for 100 days. Below is a reproduction of the calendar for 1953 covering this period. Note that State Senator Neuberger missed at least one roll call, by excused or un-excused absence, in 37 of the 100 days.
