Atomic Bombs Could Affect Earth's Air

LONDON (AP) — Prime Minister Churchill told the House of Commons Tuesday an "undue number" of atom and hydrogen bomb explosions might have serious effect on the earth's atmosphere for about 5,000 years.

He gave no indication what the number would be.

At the same time Churchill rejected a Laborite request that he appeal personally to Russia and the United States to limit nuclear explosions.

"I am not convinced," he said, "that cessation wholly or partly of these explosions would be best advanced by our intervention or by my personal intervention at the present time."

He said he believes the problem of nuclear weapons is best dealt with by the United Nations.

Baby's Attacker Given Long Term In Prison

FLORENCE, Ariz. (AP) — Bob Spencer, 24-year-old service station worker has been sentenced to 24 to 30 years imprisonment for stealing a 9-month-old baby and sexually attacking him.

Spencer pleaded guilty to charges of sodomy, aggravated assault and child stealing.

The baby, Daniel Ernest Stephens, was taken from the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. H. S. Stephens Jr., at Stanfield, a southern Arizona farming center, the night of Sept. 14.

A short time later officers found the child crying in some weeds beside a road.

Douglas Voters Approve Hospital

Douglas County voters gave their heartiest approval to the construction of a state hospital for mental patients Tuesday. The 7,000-vote margin showed heavy favor for establishing a hospital for all mental patients near Portland rather than for just senile patients.

Royal British, American Widows Dine Together

HYDE PARK, N. Y. (AP) — A royal British widow kept a luncheon date today with a noted American widow. She was just a wee bit late.

A five-car motorcade whisked Queen Mother Elizabeth of Great Britain through the gates of the Roosevelt estate here about 12:45 p.m. EST, about 15 minutes after her scheduled arrival.

She came here for a luncheon with Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt. The two had dined together here 15 years ago with their husbands—the late President Roosevelt and King George VI.

American-Supported Plan For U. N. Forces Okayed

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP) — The U. N. Political Committee Tuesday approved an American-supported plan urging all countries to help provide equipment and supplies for United Nations forces resisting any future aggression.

This principle of wider participation in U. N. military action was first approved last summer by the U. N. collective measures committee after the United States called for action to remedy problems which became apparent in the Korean conflict.

Railroad Man Stabbed In Klamath Fracas

KLAMATH FALLS (AP) — Frank Byers, 43, Dunsmuir, Calif., railroad worker, was in a critical condition in a hospital here Tuesday from a stabbing wound, apparently suffered in a fight Monday night.

Dist. Atty. Frank Alderson said the fight occurred in a Klamath Falls home where a party was being held. Byers had been stabbed by an ice pick.

Lois Ellen Gruell, 37, and Erskine Homer Fisher, 35, were arrested at the house and jailed on a charge of drunkenness.

Alderson said he was continuing his investigation.

Special Auto License Numbers Discontinued

SALEM (AP) — Oregon automobile owners won't be able to get special license numbers after next Jan. 1, Secretary of State Earl T. Newbury announced Monday.

After that date, Oregon will have a new license numbering system. Each license will contain a letter, which will indicate the month in which the license expires.

The new system, Newbury said, "makes the granting of special numbers a wasteful process."

County Snubs Subdivision

Although Douglas County was not to be directly affected by a subdivision of legislative districts in the state, voters in the county were split in their opinions on it. The split fell in favor of those against it by less than 100 votes. The subdivision was expected to involve only Multnomah County immediately.

American, German Set For 1954 Nobel Prizes

STOCKHOLM, Sweden (AP) — An American chemist and two American physicists are top candidates for the 1954 Nobel Prizes in chemistry and physics, the Stockholm Expressen said Tuesday.

Dr. Linus Pauling, professor of chemistry at the California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, Calif., is to receive the Nobel Prize in chemistry for his work about the nature of chemical bonds, the newspaper reported.

It said two German physicists, Dr. Max Born, professor of natural philosophy at the University of Edinburgh, and Dr. Walther Bothe, director of the Max Planck Institute, Heidelberg, West Germany, will share the prize in physics.

The Swedish Academy of Science is scheduled to decide on the Nobel Prizes Wednesday night. The prizes, each valued at about \$35,000, are financed under the will of Alfred Nobel, the Swedish inventor of dynamite.

Demos Control House; Senate Count In Doubt

Cordon had 185,308 votes to 175,579 for Democrat Richard L. Neuberger, but about half of Multnomah County's vote, where Neuberger had been running strongly, remained untabulated.

Either party could take Senate control by winning two of the three remaining races, since Vice President Nixon could break a tie for the Republicans if they turned up with 48 members and Morse has promised to vote with the Democrats.

The possibility arose that if Democrat Murray won in Montana where he was leading and Republican Cordon won in Oregon where he was ahead, final control might have to await a recount in New Jersey's close race.

Both Case and Howell were claiming the election, with each side serving notice it would demand a recount if the other were declared winner. Republicans predicted they would win by 196 votes. Democrats said they would have a 168-vote victory.

The Newark Evening News, which supported Case, published an independent tabulation giving Howell a 11-vote edge.
