

Marriage Relationships' Series Slated By Church

A series of discussions on marriage relationships will be offered as a community service at the First Methodist Church for five Sunday nights beginning Nov. 7.

The Rev. Ellsworth M. Tilton, who arranged the series, has specialized in the field of counseling for several years. In August he studied under Dr. Paul Popenoe, noted family relations counselor in Los Angeles. The Rev. Mr. Tilton is a member of a committee called by Gov. Paul Patterson for consultation in the field of mental health and a member of the pas-

toral services committee of the Oregon Council of Churches. He was also a former director in the Willamette Community Clinic. Assisting in the discussions on various evenings will be Dr. Glen E. Wright, chief psychologist at the Veterans Hospital; George Neuner, who will discuss the legal rights in marriage; Dr. E. J. Wainwright, Douglas County public health officer; Dr. Wayne Stauffer, marriage counselor in Eugene; and the Rev. John C. Radmore, pastor at Oakridge Methodist Church.

Sessions will start at 6:45 p.m. and continue until 8:45 with a refreshment break at 7:40. Nov. 7 the topic is "Ingredients of Marriage," stressing the preparation on which marriage should be based. Nov. 14, "Basic Rights of Each Person," George Neuner will give the legal rights and the discussion will lead into the Christian view of marriage. Nov. 21, "Differing View Points of Men and Women," Dr. Wright and Dr. Wainwright will be on a panel and discuss conflict areas of marriage. Nov. 28, during the first period those desiring to may take personality tests. This is the night of the choir festival so the second class will not meet. Dec. 5, "Working At Happiness," Dr. Stauffer will speak from his

experience as minister, chaplain and counsellor. There will be a question period. These sessions are open to all who wish to attend. There is no registration fee.

New Policy Announced For Navy Reenlistments

The U. S. Navy has formulated a new policy concerning the reenlistment of Navy veterans, reports Robert E. Lang, Navy recruiter at Roseburg.

Men who have been discharged from the Navy less than a year and at the time of discharge held one of the critical ratings are eligible to reenlist at their former rating.

The critical ratings are: Communication technician, electrician's mate, electronics technician, pipefitter, interior communication technician, mineman, radarman, radioman, sonarman or teleman.

Chief Lang added that former Navy men reenlisting after only one previous Navy enlistment may not reenlist for two, three, four or six years. More information may be secured by talking to him at the Douglas County Courthouse.

Evangelist Returns For Nazarene Rally

Revival services, under the direction of Evangelist Noble E. Berryhill, will begin at the First Church of the Nazarene Sunday at the 11 a.m. service. The meetings will continue nightly and Sundays through Nov. 21. The Rev. Robert Hempel, pastor of the church, said that the Rev. Mr. Berryhill conducted a similar meeting at the church some two years ago and is coming back by popular request.

The Rev. Mr. Berryhill was born in Texas. Since his conversion in a Salvation Army street meeting, he has been active in the Church of the Nazarene, both as pastor and evangelist. Among some of the prominent pastores which he has held are the University Avenue Church of the Nazarene in San Diego, Calif.; First Church of the Nazarene in Topeka, Kans.; and Everett Church of the Nazarene in Boston, Mass.

Before his conversion, the Rev. Mr. Berryhill served in the Marine Corps and saw active duty in Nicaragua and China. His gospel messages, which are highlighted with illustrations and anecdotes from his marine experiences, have helped to earn him the title, "The Fighting Marine Evangelist." Mrs. Berryhill, who is accompanying her husband, is a native
