

Russia, India Are Offered Voice In Atomic Peace Plan

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — The Western powers Tuesday offered Russia and India a voice in arranging a proposed international scientific conference on peaceful uses of atomic energy.

The decision was announced in the General Assembly's 60-nation Political Committee by Canada's Paul Martin who has taken an active role in recent weeks in trying to patch up East-West differences over disarmament and atomic control.

Martin called attention to what he termed the "moderate" tone of a speech which Soviet Delegate Andrei Y. Vishinsky made in the committee Monday on President Eisenhower's "atoms for peace" program. He said he hoped this foreshadowed the possible cooperation of the Soviet Union in setting up an agency to advance the development of atomic energy for non-war uses.

The proposed international scientific conference is a part of the Eisenhower program, but is separate from the permanent agency envisaged by the U. S. President. Both moves, however, are included in a resolution sponsored by the United States and six other countries.

Martin told the Political Committee that the seven sponsors of the resolution had decided to recommend that Russia and India be included in an advisory committee which will decide on which countries are to be invited to the scientific conference and on the priority of subjects to be discussed. Other members of the advisory committee would be the United States, Britain, France, Canada and Brazil.

There was no immediate word from Russia and India as to whether they would agree to serve.

Martin's reference to Vishinsky's moderate attitude apparently was inspired by the Soviet delegate's statement that Russia was willing to continue negotiations with the United States over possible cooperation in the proposed international agency.

Other delegates, however, forecast a possible East-West clash over Soviet hints that Russia would try to place the agency under the U.N. Security Council in which Russia holds veto power.

Welcome Given To Foreigners By Eisenhower

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower Tuesday extended "my very sincere welcome" to some 50,000 foreigners who will become naturalized Americans in mass swearing-in ceremonies throughout the country on Veterans' Day, this Thursday.

The President personally expressed his congratulations to 22 citizenship applicants, some with backgrounds of horror in Nazi and Russian slave labor camps.

The 22 from 18 countries included a Catholic priest who narrowly escaped execution by the Nazis, a rabbi who fled from invading Russian and German armies and a Russian seized by the Nazis in Poland in 1944 and placed in a concentration camp.

President Eisenhower Plans Duck Hunting Trip

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower plans to go duck hunting Friday and Saturday on Lake Erie near Toledo, Ohio.

Announcing this Tuesday, the White House said Eisenhower intends to stop at Toledo on the way back from his boyhood home at Abilene, Kan., where on Thursday-Veterans' Day—He will take part in dedicatory ceremonies at the Eisenhower Memorial Museum.

As previously announced, the President will fly to Kansas Wednesday and stay overnight in Abilene at the Sunflower Hotel.

In Ohio, the chief executive will be the guest of Secretary of the Treasury Humphrey at Cedar Point Club on Maumme Bay, Lake Erie.

The PIO said under present policy he will remain at his present post until he has served 23 months in the service.

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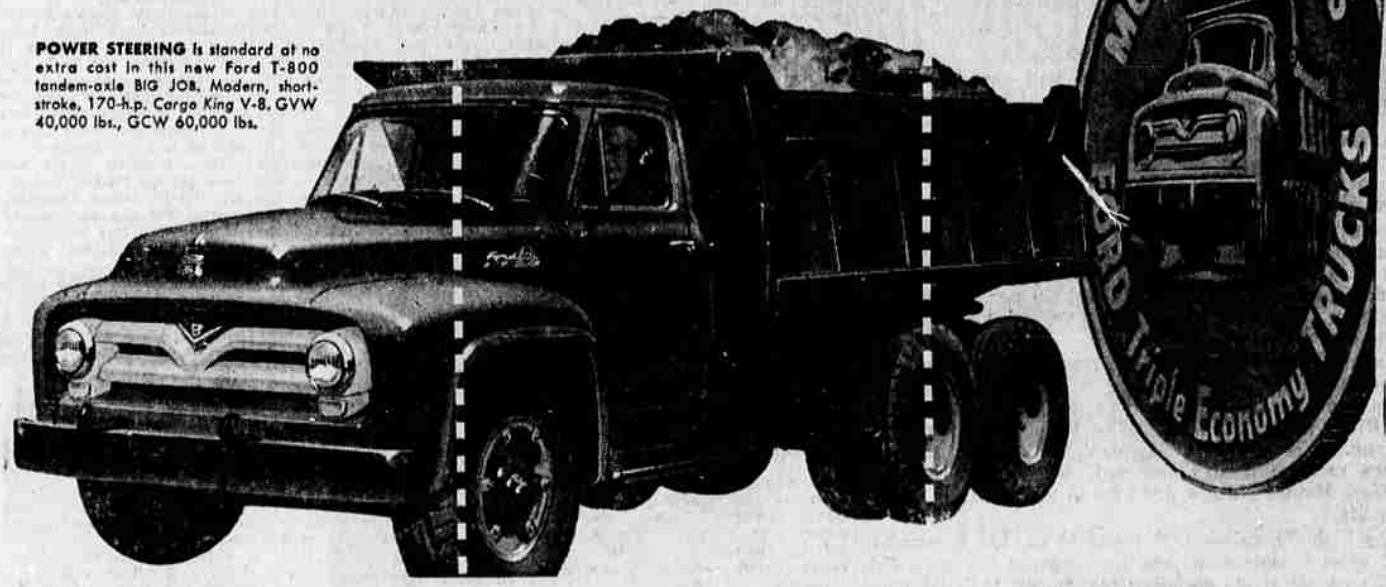
