City Building Permits Drop During October

Roseburg was one of several Oregon cities whose building permit valuations fell off in October, according to the statistical department of the Equitable Savings & Loan Assn., Portland.

During the month, permits worth \$55,305, compared to \$251,449 the month previous and \$304,599 in October 1953.

The city ranked 15th in Oregon in valuation of permits. It was in fifth place in September.

Elkton Schools Census Indicates 7 Per Cent Drop From Last Year

C. W. Henderer, clerk of School Dist. 34, reports the census of school children which he recently completed shows a 7.03 per cent decrease from last year's census. For many years the district has shown a 10 per cent gain each year. This year's trend may indicate that the peak has been reached.

397 Students

The census this year shows 397 children age four through 19 as compared to 427 last year.

An interesting feature is that the boys and girls in both census reports were evenly divided; one more boy each year than girl. Of the 397 children this year, 199 are boys and 198 are girls. Of the 427 children last year, 214 were boys and 213 were girls.

In addition to the 397, there are 138 children in the district aged one day up to four years as compared to 133 last year.
