Oregon Has Shortage Of Christmas Trees

SALEM (AP)—Oregon has a short-
age of Christmas trees because
landowners aren't allowing many
to be cut, State Forester George
Spaur said Tuesday.
"Land owners now realize the
small trees have a value and in-
discriminate pilferage or harvest
is no longer permitted," he said.
He pointed out that more than
2,000,000 acres of Western Oregon
forest lands now are in tree farms,
where Christmas tree cutting is
held to a minimum.
