National Farm Bureau President Resigns Position

NEW YORK (AP) — Allan B. Kline, president of the American Farm Bureau Federation, announced that he is resigning, effective Thursday, for reasons of health.

The announcement came as a surprise to 3,500 delegates attending the federation's annual convention.

Kline, 59, of Vinton, Iowa, has been president of the organization for seven years and was midway through his fourth term.

In his annual address, Kline said farm prices off 23 per cent from the postwar peak and warehouses bulging with surplus crops can be remedied by expanding markets, especially abroad.

He said tariffs, quotas, import and export licenses and currency controls are all "interferences with trade" and as such are "restrictions of freedom."

"We are the world's greatest trading nation," he said. "We have more to lose from restrictions of trade and more to gain from its expansion than any other country."

He said domestic demand for farm produce is good, employment is high, wages are good and productivity is rising.

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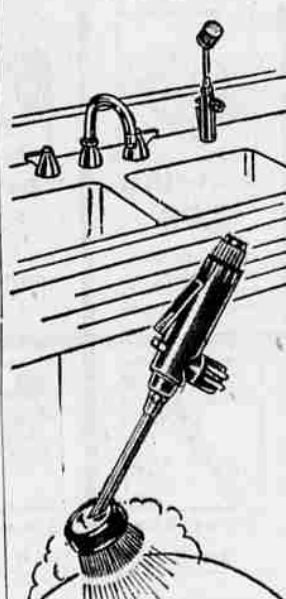
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
