Gilman received injury to his arm while playing basketball on the Douglas High School team, in Myrtle Point recently. After emergency treatment at the scene of the accident he was brought to Roseburg for treatment. Gilman is a junior at Douglas High School.

State Workers' Salary Changes Will Be Asked

SALEM (AP) — Many changes in salaries of state employees will be recommended to the Legislature by its Interim Committee on Retirement and Compensation.

Donald Spanier, who heads the salary investigation, said he has found that many salaries either are too high or too low, compared with similar jobs in private employment.

Spanier, who works for Barrington Associates, a New York management firm, said all state jobs are being classified. The survey, he added, would insure that the state gets its full value in money paid for services.

He said he plans to make his report to the committee by Jan. 15. The committee will report to the Legislature about Feb. 1. The study covers 17,000 state employees.

Sub Accident Takes 4th Life

CHATHAM, England, (AP) — A fourth man died Thursday of injuries suffered in a freak drydock accident to the British submarine Talent.

The Talent was being overhauled in the Royal Navy drydock here Wednesday when a nearby floodgate collapsed, sending tons of water against the submarine. Nearly a hundred workmen were sitting around the sub having tea when the surging waters backwashed and carried the submarine out into the River Medway and onto a mudbank, many of the workmen scrambled to safety. Others were dragged out, three of them critically injured. One of these died Thursday morning in hospital.

The body of one of three men missing in the accident was located

under a nearby floodgate Thursday. All three already had been given up for lost. Navy divers had searched the waterlogged hull this morning but found no trace of the missing.

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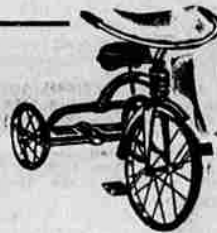
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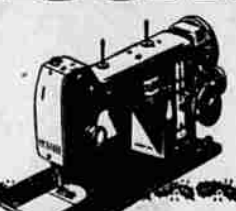
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
