

Air Force Man Hired After Giving Information, Claim

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House Un-American Activities Committee was disclosed Thursday to have hired a former Air Force captain a day after he was separated from the service for giving the committee a secret document.

The committee source who disclosed this asked that he not be named. Courtney Owens, the committee's chief investigator, said the man, Rea Van Fossom, "resigned" from the Air Force and was hired as an \$8,300-a-year investigator by the committee because he was "very highly qualified" for the job.

Friday another well-placed committee informant, also asking anonymously, said Van Fossom was an Air Force intelligence agent "fired" on Nov. 21 for supplying the committee with an FBI file on a person about whom it was taking testimony.

The committee informant gave this account:

Van Fossom had 14 years of service with the Air Force and was a decorated airman of World War II. At the time the committee was hearing testimony about the subject of the FBI file, the FBI sent copies of the document to interested executive agencies, including the Air Force.

Van Fossom, custodian of the file for the Air Force, saw that the committee staff got a copy. Then, he continued, the CIA told the FBI that the FBI had the document in the copies and pinpointed the leak. The Air Force, possibly having in mind the uproar about a similar case during the McCarthy-Army hearings last spring, asked Van

Fossom to resign with loss of his reserve commission.

During the McCarthy-Army hearings, Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis.) said he had received secret FBI information on security risks from an Army officer he would not name. That set off an argument over what rights congressional investigators have to receive classified executive branch documents.
