

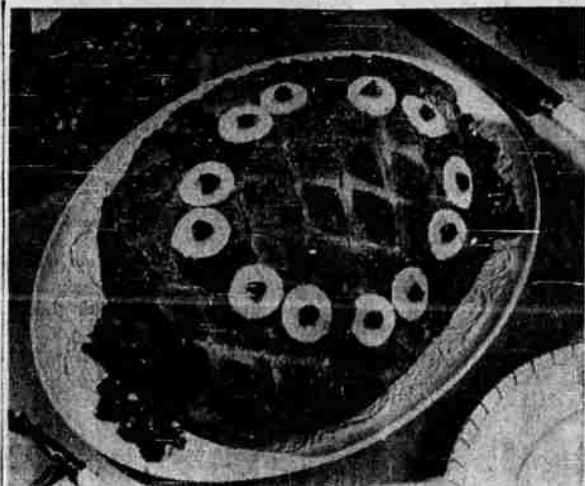

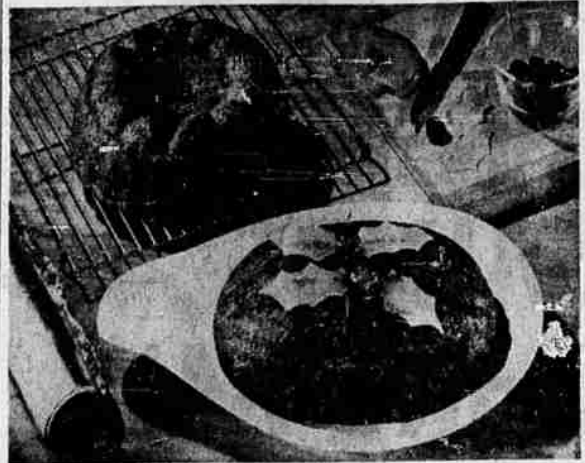
The school lunch program for Dist. 4 schools for January shows a variety of nutritive foods, offered on a well-balanced menu.

Spicy Pudding Traditional Fare

A modern version of the popular steamed Christmas St. James Pudding. Made with all the traditional, wonderful - aromatic spices, rich with the sweetness of molasses, and textured to perfection with the addition of ready-to-eat bran cereal. In its present form, the pudding need be steamed just 3 hours. Serve hot with hard sauce.

ST. JAMES PUDDING
 3 tablespoons butter, or margarine, melted
 1/2 cup (ready-to-eat bran)
 1/2 cup light molasses
 1/2 cup milk
 1 1/2 cups sifted flour
 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
 1/4 teaspoon allspice
 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
 1 cup cut dates

Combine butter, brand, molasses and milk. Sift together flour, soda, salt and spices; add to first mixture together with dates, stirring only until combined. Fill greased 1-quart mold about 2/3 full. Cover tightly. Steam 3 hours. Serve hot with hard sauce or other suitable sauce.

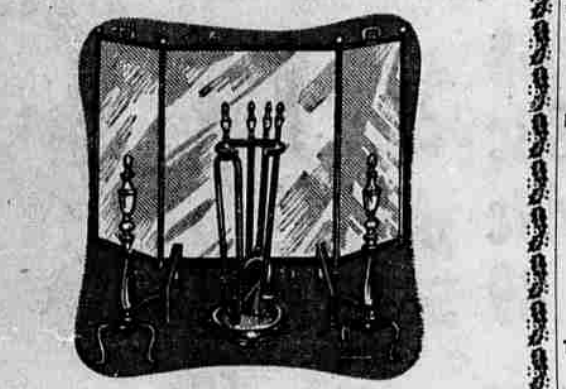
