Arctic Weather Test Scheduled For U. S. Forces

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22 — The Army and the Air Force has announced that they will conduct joint training maneuvers in Alaska next month to test men and machines under Arctic weather conditions. The exercises to run from Jan. 13 to Feb. 13 will be featured by the largest mass parachute drop of men and materials ever at-

tempted in Alaska and the construction of a packed - snow airplane runway on frozen tundra in the interior of the territory. The two services said that troops taking part in "Exercise Snowbird" may expect prolonged subzero temperatures, perhaps as low as minus 50 degrees.

In addition to Army and Air Force units already in Alaska, the Army's 503rd Regimental Combat Team of the 11th Airborne Division will be flown northward from Ft. Campbell, Ky. The airlift will be provided by the tactical air command's 18th Air Force at Seward Air Force Base. The maneuvers will be under the command of Lt. Gen. J. H. Atkinson, commander in chief, Alaska.

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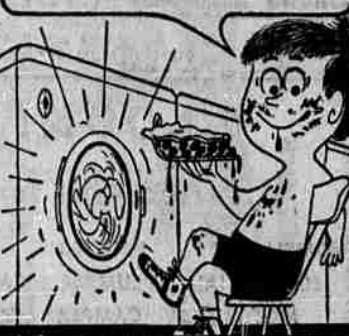

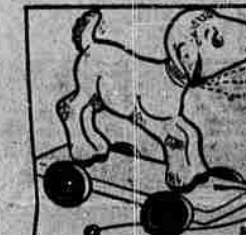

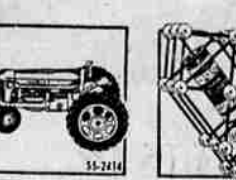
