DIOCESE TO MEET

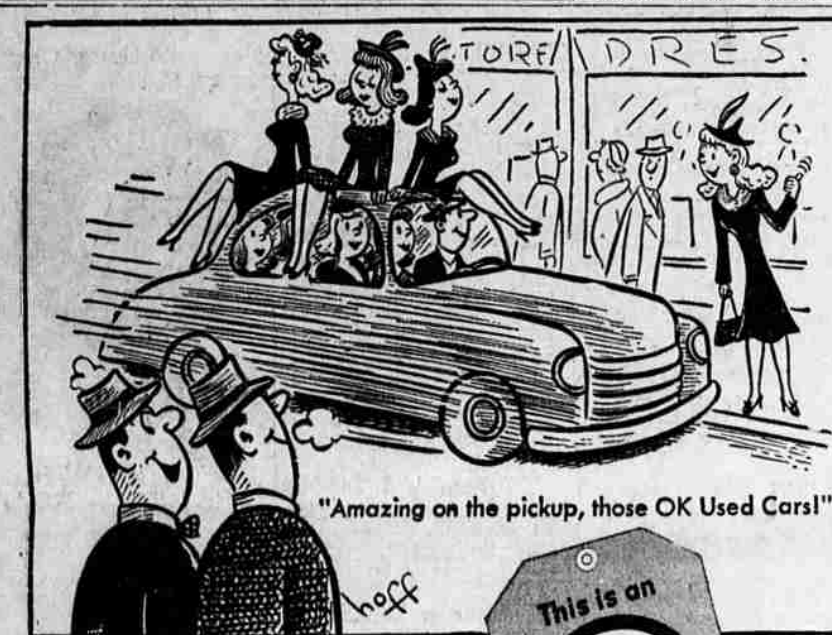
