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Rookies On Cellar Team Pro Hoop Score Leaders

NEW YORK (AP) — For the first time in the history of the National Basketball Assn. rookies from a last place club hold down the first two spots in the scoring column. Milwaukee's Frank Selvy, who broke virtually all the college records at Furman last year, regained first place with a total of 707 points according to official statistics released Tuesday. And only one point back of him is teammate Bob Pettit, former Louisiana State All-American.

Selvy, who was on top six of the first seven weeks before slipping to fourth last week, jumped back out in front with 115 points in six games. Pettit moved up from eighth to second with 179 in the same number of games.

Dolph Schayes of Syracuse remained in third with 675 points. Boston's Ed Macauley, last week's leader, dropped to a tie for fifth with Philadelphia's Neil Johnston.

Chisox Boss Sees Indians As Threat

CHICAGO (AP) — Marty Marion, new manager of the Chicago White Sox is bubbling over with pennant hopes and tabs Cleveland as the big team to beat.

"Although the Yankees got Bob Turley, Don Larsen and Bill Hunter," said Marion, former St. Louis Cardinal shortstop star. St. Louis Browns manager and White Sox coach, "I see Cleveland as our chief rival."

"The Yankees are going to miss Gene Woodling. Turley is a fine pitcher but the fact he lost 15 games for Baltimore last year proves he can lose."

But at a whole, the entire American League is going to be a lot stronger. Detroit and Boston look good with their young players jelling."

Marion, who succeeded Paul Richards when he went to Baltimore, believes the White Sox have improved so much through added strength that a pennant is not out of reach.

"For three straight years, the Sox have been third," he said. "It's time to move up. In many talks with Richards last year, we agreed that the club as it then was made up had reached its peak."

"Since you can't get standout players without giving up some of your own, the building of a good bench is the best thing."

Marion thinks that first baseman Walt Dropo and outfielder Bob Nieman, both obtained from Detroit in the Ferris Fain deal, will give the Sox much-needed power.

Big League Clubs Make Offer In Suit

DALLAS, Tex. (AP) — Thirteen major league baseball clubs Monday offered to settle for \$200,000 a 12 million dollar anti-trust suit filed against them by the Liberty Broadcasting System of Dallas.

Gordon McLendon, who brought the suit as head of Liberty, said the compromise offer was a "victory" for his bankrupt broadcasting system.

"I am against the amount of the compromise," he said "but whether we accept it is up to the trustees."

The compromise offer by the American and National League teams was filed in U.S. District Court, Chicago, where the suit was to be tried April 18.

A copy was filed with U.S. bankruptcy commissioner D. M. Oldham here.

The suit grew out of a hassle between the broadcasting system and the major league teams over "re-created" broadcasts of his league games.

McLendon would receive telegraphic reports of a game in progress, dub in sound, and broadcast a play by play of the action.

Liberty contended a direct cause of its bankruptcy was the refusal of major leagues to permit it to receive these telegraphic reports.

At its peak, the broadcasting system had 435 stations affiliated with it.

Fern Ridge Reservoir In Need Of Fishermen

Anglers wanted! The fishery in Fern Ridge Reservoir is in no way overexploited.

Recent surveys by the Oregon Game Commission indicate an excellent population of white crappie up to two pounds in weight and cutthroat trout in the 10 to 12-inch bracket. Some very fine largemouth black bass are also available. Up to now relatively light fishing pressure has prevailed.

To interest the angler and to insure a greater utilization of these waters, tentative plans call for the construction of brush shelters to be placed at strategic locations throughout the reservoir. The brush shelters will serve to concentrate the white crappie at these points. They may also be used as reference points by the angler which should result in more fish being taken.

The season for fishing for warm-water species of fish is open year around at Fern Ridge. So most any time the spirit moves you, it is permissible to try for the reservoir dwellers.

The reservoir is located approximately 10 miles west of Eugene.

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Ex-Solon President Puts Stock To Sale

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Eddie Mulligan, who resigned Thursday as president of the Sacramento Solons, said Tuesday he hopes to sell his personal stock in that Pacific Coast League club in two or three days.

"My stock is for sale, he said, "and negotiations are now being completed for its purchase. I hope to consummate the deal in the next couple of days. He declined to say who was interested in his 304 shares.

Mulligan, president and treasurer of the club since late 1950 and still a director, said he had no immediate plans for the future. He added, however, that he probably "will remain in baseball."

Mulligan was replaced as Solon president by Fred David, Sacramento tobacco wholesaler.

Mulligan will remain as Solon representative in league matters until the Sacramento front office is reorganized. He is on a committee with Brick Laws of Oakland and Damon Miller of San Francisco to select a president of the Pacific Coast League. The loan presidency was vacated late last year when Clarence (Pants) Rowland resigned to become executive vice president of the Chicago Cubs of the National League.

FIREMAN GETS REWARD

BROOKLYN (AP) — "Fireman" Jim Hughes, ace relief hurler for the Dodgers, topped all National League pitchers in the number of relief appearances in 1954. He played in 60 games.

His efforts were rewarded by the New York City fire department which named him an honorary fire chief.

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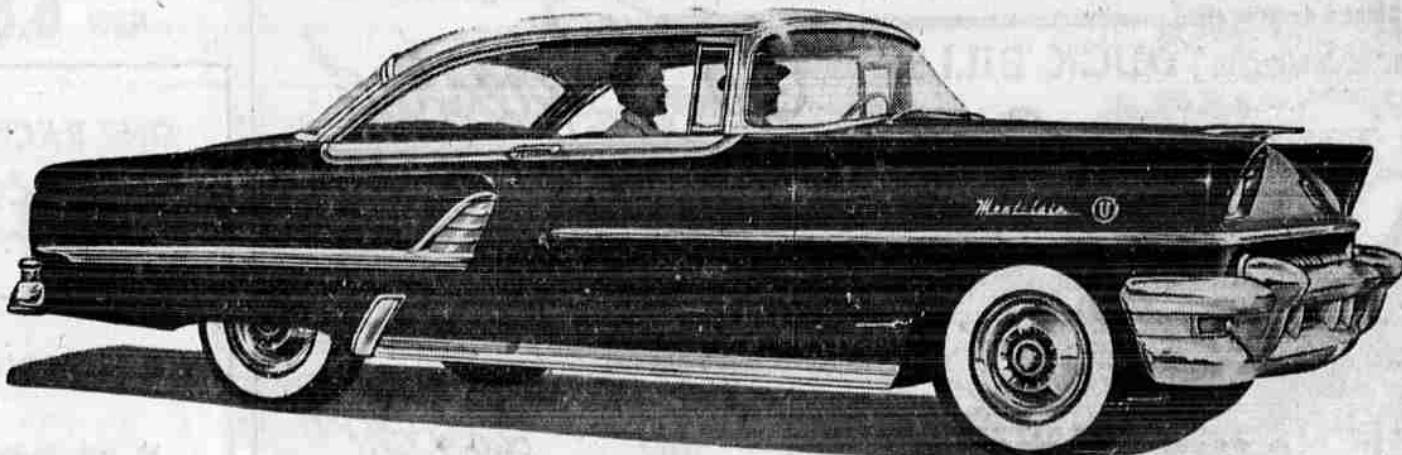
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
