False Denial Of Being Red Draws 5-Year Rap

SEATTLE (AP) — Avalo Allison Fisher, 41, former Snohomish County labor union official, was sentenced Monday to five years in federal prison for falsely swearing he was not a Communist.

Fisher, one-time executive board member of the Sultan local of the CIO International Woodworkers of America, has announced he will appeal. He continues free on \$5,000 bond.

Before he was sentenced, Fisher read a lengthy statement protesting his innocence and proclaiming he is guilty of no crime. He referred to his conviction as "part of a cold-blooded plan to frighten good Americans," and he identified his case with those of what he called "labor heroes of the past."

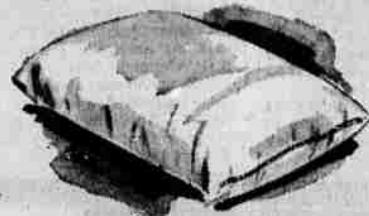

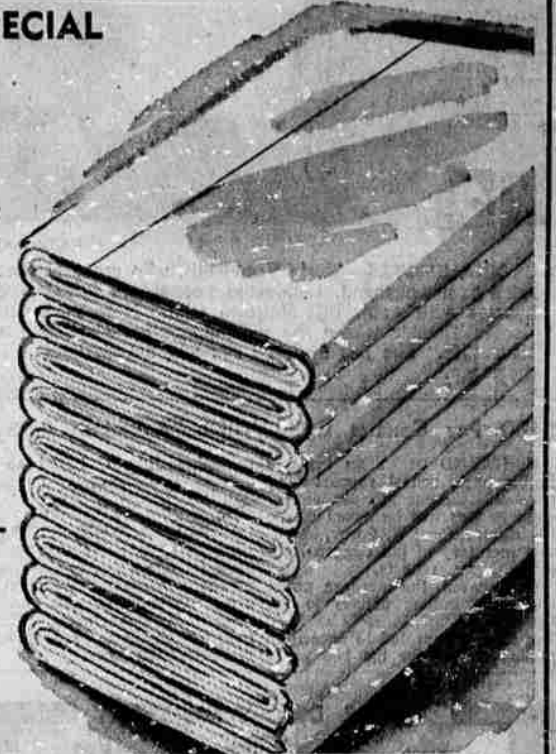
