

Sutherland Building Permits Exceed Half Million

Valuation of building permits issued in Sutherland during 1954 amounted to \$559,511, according to J. C. Irwin, city building inspector. One hundred forty-two permits were taken out during the year. The biggest category was in residential construction, with the city licensing construction of 39 new homes valued at \$303,200. Ninety-four permits for remodeling came to \$104,011. Remainder of the permits were grouped under a category for churches, etc. Nine were taken out and were valued at \$132,300, Irwin said.
